Santa Rosa Village is our freshmen community village. It includes double bedrooms, shared bathrooms, study rooms, family rooms, and a large community living room and kitchen.

Santa Cruz Village is home to our second-year students as well as some upper-division students. It features mainly two-bedroom, one-bathroom suites for four to six students. This community includes a gym, art studio, dance studio and gaming room open to all students who live in housing.

Apartments in Anacapa Village have fourbedrooms, two-bathrooms, a kitchen, and sitting rooms. We offer many community spaces across our living area that all housing residents are able to use such as a pool and spa, BBQ, study rooms, computer labs, surfboard storage room, and more!



6 Arroyo Hall go.csuci.edu/wellness

Arroyo Hall includes the Recreation Center, Wellness Promotion & Education, Dolphin Pantry, and Disability Accommodations & Support Services. The Recreation Center offers a full-service gym with weight and cardio machines and fitness classes. Nearby are multi-use fields for soccer, lacrosse, flag football, Ultimate Frisbee, softball and more.

This facility provides science and technology students with cutting-edge robotics and geology labs, as well as multimode lecture halls and classrooms. It houses our expanding programs in Anthropology, Computer Science, ESRM, Mechatronics Engineering, Physics and Psychology The second floor's garden terrace is an excellent space to spend time outdoors.

The North Quad is an open space for students to gather in between classes or study outdoors underneath one of the many trees. It's surrounded by buildings that house classrooms, as well as faculty and staff offices, which include Napa, Solano, Madera, Manzanita and Del Norte Halls.
