Understanding Accreditation

Why is accreditation important?

Accreditation is the recognition from an accrediting agency (WSCUC) that our institution maintains a certain level of educational standards. Basically, it means that a CSUCI degree has VALUE and that CSUCI remains in good standing to remain open and continue to receive federal and state funding to award financial aid and grants.

What kind of accreditation are we pursuing?

Thematic Pathway for Reaffirmation (TPR) is a streamlined, alternate pathway for reaffirmation for eligible institutions that demonstrate consistent evidence of a sustained quality performance.






