# Transfer Admission Criteria

Fall admission is based on official transcripts and information you reported on your application. Your admission may be rescinded if your coursework and grades are lower than what is reported on the application. Please make sure to report accurate information. The Admissions & Recruitment office will contact you via email and your Dolphin VIP page if more information is required.

To be considered for admission to CI, all applicants must at the very minimum, have the following:

- A minimum of 60 or more semester transferable units or 90 quarter units
- Be in good standing at the last institution attended
- A minimum 2.00 GPA for a California resident, 2.40 for non-California resident
- Complete the following courses with a grade of “C” or better:
  - Oral Communication
  - Written Communication
  - Critical Thinking
  - Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning\*

\*College Algebra is acceptable in meeting this requirement only if the course is from an accredited California Community College or a California State University (CSU) campus. The course must also appear on the community college’s GE-Breadth pattern and the CSU campus’s GE pattern.

- All admission requirements must be completed by the end of the Spring 2012 term for Fall 2012 admissions.
- Meet all deadlines set by the Admissions & Recruitment office.

## Online Application

The preferred method of application is online through [www.csumentor.edu](http://www.csumentor.edu). If you cannot apply online, you should contact the Admissions & Recruitment office to make special arrangements to apply electronically with campus assistance.

## Official Transcripts

CI requires official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended to process an admission decision. If you have coursework from an institution outside of the United States, you are required to submit an official transcript from that school in addition to a certified detailed evaluation report. ## General Education (GE) Pattern

In preparation for admission to CI, applicants are advised to complete all lower-division General Education (GE) courses by the end of Spring 2012 for Fall 2012 admission. The following GE patterns are acceptable:

### ***GE Certification***

Students transferring from a California Community College can complete the CSU GE–Breadth certification pattern to satisfy all lower-division GE requirements.

### ***Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)***

The IGETC is a series of courses that California Community College students can use to satisfy lower-division GE requirements for any CSU or UC campus.

## Lower-Division Major Preparation

Applicants are advised to complete the lower-division courses for preparation into the major. CSU Channel Islands has articulation agreements with local area community colleges. Students should check the following website and meet with their community college counselor to ensure proper academic planning.

## Estimated Cost of Undergraduate Attendance Per Year

All students, regardless of residency status, pay tuition fees which are dependent on budgets beyond CI's control and are subject to change without notice. Non-residents of California pay tuition of \$372 per unit in addition to these fees. The following example shows the estimated nine-month costs for a student living in University housing and taking 15 units per semester for 2011/2012.

Books and supplies	\$1,700
On-campus food and housing	\$11,975
Transportation	\$1,250
Personal	\$3,058

## Conditional/ Provisional Admission

CSU Channel Islands makes preliminary offers of admission to transfer applicants based upon self-reported units and “College Courses” information included in the CSU application for admission. Applicants for whom admission decisions cannot be made on the basis of self-reported information will be notified via email or Dolphin VIP page of additional documentation required.

A provisional/conditional admission offer may be rescinded for applicants who do not accurately report their academic performance or who do not retain CSU eligibility at the end of the spring term, e.g., failure to complete courses in progress, failure to maintain the grade point average, etc.

## Disqualified Students

If you have previously been academically disqualified from CI, you must petition for academic reinstatement. Only until you have been approved by the Academic Appeals Board can you be admitted and allowed to enroll at CI. ## Nursing Applicants

Nursing is the only impacted major at CI. Nursing applicants must select Pre-Nursing as their major when applying online. In addition, a separate application must be submitted to the Nursing program. ## Lower Division Applicants

CI only accepts applications from students with less than 60 semester transferable units for the Nursing program. Lower Division applicants are expected to meet the Written Communication & Mathematics/ Quantitative Reasoning requirement, in addition to meeting the freshmen eligibility requirements. Applicants are required to submit an official high school transcript, SAT or ACT scores, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.
