| Brief Activity Description | <p>In keeping with CI's institutional mission-based outcomes to graduate students who will possess an education ...to address the highly complex issues facing societies, the Center for Community Engagement is requesting funds that would allow CI students to participate in four separate service days (i.e. United Way Day of Service, Martin Luther King Jr., Cesar Chavez Day of Service and Learning). The fourth is still TBD but most likely will be Veteran's Day. These service days will be under the service initiative, Serve It UP a collaboration between Multi Access Programs in Student Life and student leaders.</p> <p>Now in it's second year, Serve It Up, is a year-long program, designed to contribute to building a culture of service and by providing the CSU Channel Islands community with service opportunities in Ventura County. All participants will be provided with a Serve It Up t-shirt, lunch, bus transportation and an opportunity to participate in several days of service.</p> <p>It is our vision to "adopt" a non-profit organization each year focusing all service events at this one site, doing so allows for mutual campus-community benefits and sustainable community partnerships. The service projects will be developed in collaboration with the organization and student leaders will assist in the development, implementation and outreach for the project.</p> <p>By creating a "service initiative" this cross-divisional collaboration strives to: 1) contribute to building a culture of service at CI, 2). create an opportunity to become aware of local issues, 3) contribute to making a difference in the community 4) create a community among CI students, 4). brand service as altruistic adventurism.</p> <p>It is our goal that this initiative will eventually be led by a student committee with oversight from the CCE and Multi Access Programs in Student Life (i.e. the student committee will choose the organization to adopt, lead outreach and marketing efforts and implement and oversee the service days).</p> <p>CI participants will register for service days via a Wufoo application. Participants will meet on campus on the day of the event for a short orientation and then ride together on the bus to the service sites. Participants will leave CI by Roadrunner Shuttle, and taken to their service site from 8:00-2:00 PM. The CCE will meet with the campus Risk Manager to ensure all field trip policies are followed.</p> <p>This activity links to the institutional mission-based outcome, many UNIV courses, but specifically to UNIV 250 (and it links to CI's institutional mission-based outcomes): Sophomore Seminar.
