Brief Activity Description	Students, as members of interdisciplinary mentoring teams (i.e., Cl undergraduates, Cl faculty members, and CINP professionals), will actively participate in CINP research and interpretation. Specifically the students will participate in the following project components:  1. Creation of Santa Rosa Island Map Layers: Assemble and collect information/images associated with the following five map layers: a. Santa Rosa Island as Place: Georeferenced aerial photo of island to connect all data/images to specific latitude and longitude coordinates. b. Santa Rosa Island as History. Documentation of human history on and interactions with the island (i.e., Chumash, European explorers, ranchers etc.). c. Santa Rosa Island as Land: Data and images of a variety of environment variables (i.e., substrate, vegetation, wildlife, etc.) d. Santa Rosa Island National Park as Discovery. Locations, objectives, and discoveries of scientific and anthropogenic research on the island. e. Santa Rosa Island as a 21st century Identity: Integration of images and text documenting the current human experience (i.e., students, researchers, park visitors, etc.) and connection to the Island (i.e., the "selfies", see below).
Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	This IRA is directly related to the regular requirements of upper division art classes. Indeed, this activity would concretize what is normally asked of advanced art students: one is the understanding and analysis of a particular topic and the second is the translation of that personal analysis into an esthetic visual language. In this particular case, the topic will be Santa Rosa Island and its visual imagry, its resulting documentation will be a serie of original as well as re-documented photographic artworks that deal with this very topic.  Learning outcomes for the students will be:  > An understanding of the human impact on Santa Rosa's landscape and ecology  > Apersonal investigation of this topic  > The creation of photographic artistic and documented works and accompanying written statements based on these analyses  > The mounting of an art exhibit at one of Cl's galleries that will display the created artworks to the general public, as well as traveling the work in the greater community.  > An altogether greater engagement in the good stewardship of our natural resources.
Description of Assessment Process	Students will assess their activity at Santa Rosa Island in three separate ways:  1. In creating an artwork whose topic will be based on 'Santa Rosa Island and its Human Footprint  2. In writing an artist statement on their personal approach as well as a reflection on the process  3. In verbalizing these thoughts during an exhibition to be arranged after the experience.
