Brief Activity Description	Pomona College Professor of Sociology and Chicana/o-Latina/o Studies Gilda Ochoa's new book, Academic Profiling: Latinos, Asian Americans, and the Achievement Cap, looks closely at one California public high school where the inequalities between Asian American and Latino students—the two fastest-growing demographic groups in the United States—are stark. Through her extensive research, Ochoa makes it evident that achievement is a gap made ever wider by a performance-based system that has created chasms based on race, class, deeply held assumptions and test scores. By focusing on students' experiences, Ochoa exposes the many faults in our educational system and the ways that students and our communities are hurt. Professor Ochoa will deliver a campus talk based on her recently published book and current research on the achievement gap and will also meet with members of the Lacayo vista Leadership Academy, directed by Kaia Tollefson in the School of Education.
