<b>Brief Activity Description</b>	<p>This fieldtrip is part of Anthropology 445, "The Seacoast through Time." In the course, students learn about human activities associated with coastal and marine resources and environments, both in the past and present. Travel to the Port of Long Beach will help students experience and better understand the challenges associated with globalization and its effects in and within coastal and marine environments, as well as the benefits and challenges associated with the exploitation and management of coastal and marine resources.</p> <p>For this fieldtrip, students will learn all the activities associated with running the port of Long Beach (transportation to/from the port, ships and shipbuilding, environmental laws, public policy related to shipping and marine resource protection), and will also take a tour of the harbor by boat.</p> <p>The IRA monetary request will cover a Road Runner shuttle to the harbor, as well as the cost of the charter boat. The requested amount of \$3,721.73 is a maximum estimate of the cost of this trip.</p> <p>a) Land transportation: The Road Runner cost estimate for a mini bus with seating for 42 is \$120/hour (CI rate). The budget reflects an 8am departure and a 7pm arrival. This also estimates 2 hour travel time each way to/from Long Beach, plus the 1.5 hour boat tour, time for lunch, as well as speakers from the Port of Long Beach. If the trip takes less time, then fewer funds will be needed as the trip will be shorter.</p> <p>b) Boat Charter: the boat charter is a flat fee of \$1,200 for 1.5 hours, for up to 100 passengers.</p> <p>Final note: The class enrollment is usually between 30-35 students. The only shuttle option is a 42 person vehicle. The boat charter is a flat fee for up to 100 individuals. I expect two faculty members to attend the trip. We will have possible space on the trip for additional students and/or faculty, and I will solicit additional passengers if possible, to fully use IRA funds and expose additional CI students to the port and its inner workings.</p>
<b>Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings</b>	<p>Anthropology 445 : The Sea Coast through Time</p> <p>This fieldtrip encompasses the entirety of the SLOs for ANTH 445— which follow</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• discuss the different directions of human social development in various coastal regions of the world</li> <li>• compare the human impacts on coastal societies, environments, and resources</li> <li>• explain the legacies of natural catastrophes on human cultures and societies</li> <li>• describe the diversity of maritime and coastal technologies</li> <li>• apply knowledge of past human societies to local and global issues today</li> </ul> <p>The Port provides a case study for each major theme of the class, as we will discuss/learn about past human use of the area (pre modern port), with a focus on contemporary issues related to ship and harbor technology, shipping, fishing and resource management, human impacts on coastal and marine resources, natural catastrophes such as long term drought and the effect on pollution, wildlife, etc.</p>
<b>Description of Assessment</b>	Assessment will focus on the ways students bring the information they learn during the trip to class discussion, class exams, and written assignments such as their public policy papers.
