Students will be recruited through campus marketing (Black Student Union, Jambo Jambo, Coalition of Women of Color, Student Government, and Campus wide), campus flyers, and social media. Members of the CI Black Faculty and Staff Association will select 15 students and 3 alternates to attend the trip.

Comments	To the IRA Committee: I've corresponded with the proposer, and explained my belief that CI should not be offering courses that are restricted to members of a certain race/ethnicity (there are other concerns as well, such as no syllabus coming with the proposal). At the same time, there are many good elements in this proposal, and I would encourage the committee to consider a re-framed proposal, one that turns this into a trip while taking out the UNIV 391 aspect. There are previous examples of this, such as the trip that Prof. Jennie Luna proposed for a group to go out to Santa Rosa Island (I don't know the IRA Proposal # for that). If the proposer has the opportunity to re-frame the proposal so that it removes some of the problematic elements while linking to instructionally related activities, it seems to me that there would be much good to support.
