The training challenges current assumptions, our expectations, and employs a lens of masculinity to enhance knowledge and skills when working with this population.</p> <p>After the workshop, a screening of Bristlecone Project Documentary will be shown. This 30 minute emotional documentary, as told by the men themselves, is the story of reclaimed healthy and meaningful lives after experiencing childhood sexual abuse.</p>
