#### A German History of a New University (1908 and 2003)

The start of Zeppelin University as a state accredited university in 2003 was enabled by the "Zeppelin Foundation", established in 1908.

Germans donated 3,5 Mio. Goldmark to Count Zeppelin in 1908 to rebuild his airship after it was destroyed in an accident. The remaining funds were earmarked for the financing of cultural and educational institutions. ,ZU' is an outgrowth of this century-old fund!

#### Studying at ZU

Although it is a tight-knit community, Zeppelin University welcomes people of all cultures. Its small classes of 30 students or less per lecture, the system of one-to-one academic and career advising (TandemCoaching), and the accessibility of our faculty and staff, all go to ensure an individualized approach to learning. Zeppelin University's departments are ranked among Germany's top-ten programs in the ranking of the Center for Higher Education Development, CHE.

International students may attend Zeppelin University in one of three capacities: as an exchange student from a ZU partner school; as a study abroad student from a non-partner university; or as a degree seeking student.

#### **Admission Requirements**

Applicants to the undergraduate school must present the equivalent of a German Abitur. Applicants to the graduate school must present the equivalent of an undergraduate degree from a recognized university. Zeppelin University requires international applicants to demonstrate German language proficiency at the B 2 level or above. There are several ways to do this: Via a certificate from a recognized German language school; the Goethe Institut Kleines Sprach Diplom; or a TestDaf score of 4. In addition, applicants to the graduate school must submit a minimum TOEFL score of 220 computer or 79 internet based.

#### Housing

There are three forms of living options: In a host family – to get the real German experience –, in the student dormitories or in a flat somerwhere around the University. More information will be given by Beatrice Vallo.
