Look for Purple

Purple signs, irrigation pipes, and sprinkler heads indicate areas of recycled water use. This water is provided by the local water reclamation facility and used for landscape irrigation.



RECYCLED WATER *is* SAFE FOR:

- Safe for irrigating lawns, landscapes and playgrounds
- Safe for decorative fountains
- Safe for fire protection
- Safe for dust control
- Many additional non-contact uses

RECYCLED WATER *is not* SAFE FOR:

- Filling pools and spas or any other body-contact uses
- Cooking or drinking
- Irrigating vegetables and herbs (unless a drip or bubbler system is used)
- Do not connect any plumbing to purple pipes

RECYCLED WATER CAN:

- Reduce stress on California's drinking water supplies
- Reduce the use of drinking water where it is not needed
- Reduce diversion of water from delicate environmental areas
- Reduce water pollution
- Reduce disposal to water bodies, which helps the ocean
- Save Energy

💧 Recycled water is regulated and monitored to ensure that only high-quality water is distributed. Decades of experience have shown that recycled water is a safe and reliable water source.
