
24% of 2020 CI Graduates have secured new employment related to their field, an increase of 7% from 2019. 45% of graduates will be working or plan to work following graduation in Ventura County.

Survey Summary

 Survey administered to 1228 graduating students during the commencement registration, February 2020 - May 2020.

Post-Graduation Plans



- 26% of undergrads have secured new jobs by graduation, an increase of 8% points from 2019.
- Of those who have secured new employment, 68% are full-time and 94% reported that their job is related to their major. 69% of those continuing at their current job reported that their job is related to their major.
- Female grads, grads who received pell grants and grads from historically underrepresented groups were statistically less likely to secure jobs than their counterparts.
- Among majors with more than 10 grads, Nursing grads secured the highest levels of new employment (62%). ESRM, Political Science, Comp Science, Comm, and Elementary Ed grads also reported new employment rates above 35%.

Where will graduates work?

 The most common industries that CI grads will work or are looking for work, are Health science (16%), Education (16%), Human services (14%), Business (13%) and STEM (9%).

- 50% of graduates who got new jobs will be working in Ventura County. 68% of graduates remaining at their current job already work in Ventura County.
- 15% of graduates starting new jobs reported learning about their job through CSUCI in 2020, down 2% from 2019.

Graduate Students

- Those finishing with graduate degrees comprised 2% of respondents in 2020, down from 4% in 2019.
 The most popular grad majors are Biotech (52%), MBA (33%), Computer Science (10%), and Education 5%).
- 29% of graduate students have secured new jobs by graduation which is more than the undergraduate percentage (26%). Of the additional 52% of graduate grads who will be staying on at their current job, 29% are in a full-time position.
- 100% of graduate grads reported that they will be working at jobs or will be looking for jobs in California. Of those respondents, 48% are planning to stay in Ventura County.

Career Development Services

- 50% of graduates reported using Career Development Services (CDS) at least once at their time at CI, up 1% from 2019.
- Graduates who completed an internship have higher rates of new employment (27%) than those who did not complete an internship (25%).
- Graduates who reported using CDS at least once were statistically more likely to have completed an internship while at CI (21% vs 15%). Further, graduates who reported using CDS at least once were statistically more likely to have found new employment (28%) than those graduates that did not (22%).
