DATE (S) OF ACTIVITY: OCTOBER 16TH – OCTOBER 18TH, 2015

### **(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY:**

Students enrolled in ESRM/COMM/POLS 443: Environmental Communication, participated in a 3-day (2 night) trip to Santa Rosa island (16 students total benefited from this IRA grant). While on the island, students participated in an ongoing service learning project where they gathered seeds and repaired fencing for an ongoing trail restoration project on the island. They also engaged in the development of an outreach plan focused engaging the Latino/as community in initiatives related to the Island. Students related their experience to class content and readings both during and after the trip.

### **(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?**

Four particular course SLOs relate to the Island experience:

Identify the benefits and challenges of collaboration in resolving environmental disputes,

- √ Demonstrate the importance of civic engagement and advocacy as it relates to environmental communication and behavior;
- √ Explore the interplay between culture and nature as well as the charges and implications of environmental justice;
- √ Articulate a critical perspective on local/global environmental issues and contemporary events by examining the rhetorical mechanisms used in oral, written, and visual arguments about the environment;
- √ Identify the role of the media in shaping perceptions about the environment, consumption patterns, and environmental risk.

Through discussion and experiential learning opportunities, students were able to directly assess how engagement in community issues creates ownership of policy that impacts our environment. Specifically they were able to contextualize how to better engage various underrepresented communities.

Typical comments spoke to a better understanding of the issues relating to community/stakeholder perspectives of the future of the Island. Many students have never had an experience like this before and through their comments, it is obvious this experience was one of the most profound experiences of their academic career.
