Brief Activity Description	"Nevertheless She Persisted" is a campus-wide event hosting 3 guest speakers who will address issues of gender equality, culture and voice. Each presenter will speak for 20 minutes on their area of expertise followed by a Q&A from participants. After presentations and Q&A, the speakers will engage in a workshop with participants to discuss ways they can locally organize for gender equality and voice.
	Dr. Mara Berkland, Professor at North Central College in Illinois will focus on gender and culture and the ways the laws and customs perpetuate gendered inequity through their execution (specifically in the US, Morocco, and India).
	Brittany James, Mediator for Arizona's Attorney General will discuss ways to address issues of suppressed voice and gender inequality through dialogue and community engagement.
	Liz Rivera, Director of Utah Foster Care will speak to issues of women in politics and how they have historically and continue to challenge patriarchal systems of subtle silencing.
	Each presenter will be offered a small honorarium of \$1200. They will be responsible for their own travel expenses.
Learning Outcomes and Relation to IRA to Course Offerings	This event is directly related to course offerings in the communication program, specifically COMM321: Intercultural Communication and COMM 340: Conflict Management and Mediation.

COMM321: **Identity barriers - such as racism or systems of privilege - that arise from histories of colonization, exploitation, and discrimination and learn way to creatively address these inequities; **Cain a critical perspective on local/global issues and contemporary events by examining the historical and political dimensions of intercultural relations that illustrate the need for improved cross-cultural understanding and communication;
	COMM340: **Convey how issues relevant to social, cultural, political, and historical realities interact with each other and support the resolution of interperson organizational and community conflict.
	Because of the nature of the event, it is also related to courses in political science, sociology and history.
Description of Assessment Process	Participants will be given a survey to assess the presentation and relevance of topic to their academic experience. Results will be shared with presenters.
	Students enrolled in COMM321 and COMM340 courses taught by Dr. Clarke will write an assessment paper linking the event to course concepts (2 sections). Students enrolled in other COMM321 and COMM340 sections will be encouraged to do so (however it is up to the instructors of thos courses).
