*2. Brief Activity Description

The purpose of the trip is to introduce students in Biol 433 (Ecology and the Environment) to the ecology of the Channel Islands. Students will participate in or a weekend trip to Santa Rosa Island which is part of the Channel Islands National Park. While on the island students will participate in both guided hikes and, intertidal surveys.

***3.** Learning Outcomes and Relation of IRA to Course Offerings

The Island field trip will address several student-learning outcomes:

(a) understand the history of the Channel Islands

(b) familiarize students with endemic, native and exotic species

(c) evaluate the methods currently being used to restore the island

(d) quantify the effectiveness of the different management strategies adopted and consider their controversial nature.

(e) observe and consider the distinct plant and animal communities and how they relate to island biogeography

(f) appreciate the islands as a repository for the biodiversity of this region

The trip includes a crossing of the Santa Barbara Channel where marine fauna will be identified. Once on the islands, experienced naturalists will take the students on several guided hikes. They will be introduced to the unique aspects of the ecology of the many plant communities, and identify the dominant, endemic, and indicator plant species to be found on the island.

Students will gain perspective of the entire ecosystem, encompassing the flora and fauna of the island, the intertidal region and the marine systems of the surrounding channels.

Biology 433 (Ecology and the Environment) investigates the ecological characteristics of natural ecosystems and the basic effects of human society upon those ecosystems. In addition, plant and animal distribution patterns in relation to past and present physical and biotic factors are covered. Issues of resource management, population, food production, global environmental problems are also emphasized. Field trips to local ecosystems are and integral and essential component to further student learning.
