A "'Hero's' Welcome" to CSU Channel Islands' Newest Canine Team

The CSU Channel Islands Police Department is excited to announce the arrival of its newest canine team, Officer Dan Borgstrom and his German shepherd partner named "Hero." Borgstrom and Hero recently completed 12 weeks of basic training and are now certified by the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) in patrol functions as well as narcotics detection. Officer Borgstrom has been with the department since April of 2005.

The University's previous canine, "Freida" left the police department in February of 2008 with her handler, Corporal Tom Finnerty, as they joined the ranks at CSU Northridge. The new team will have regular campus patrols and are anxious for Hero to meet members of his new campus community.


