Fight the Flu! Vaccines To Be Available Soon



The flu can spread easily from person to person and the campus is taking steps to help prevent the spread of the seasonal flu and H1N1 virus by offering seasonal flu vaccines and reminding everyone to follow these simple steps:

Protect Yourself Against the Flu

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you sneeze or cough, and throw the tissue in the trash after using it.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Alcohol-based hand cleaners are also effective.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- If you are being treated for a chronic disease or are currently pregnant, you should discuss preventative measures with your personal physician.

Vaccine Cost

Students: Free

Faculty and Staff: \$2.00 (exact change please)

Who Should Not be Vaccinated:

Some people should not be vaccinated without first consulting a physician. These people include:

- Those who have a severe allergy to chicken eggs.
- Those who have had a severe reaction to an influenza vaccination in the past.
- Those who developed <u>Guillain-Barré syndrome</u> (GBS) within six weeks of getting an influenza vaccine previously.
- Children less than six months of age (the influenza vaccine is not approved for use in this age group).
- Those who have a moderate or severe illness with a fever should wait to get vaccinated until their symptoms lessen.

Direct Deposit Your Paycheck

Payroll Services would like to encourage all employees to consider signing up for Direct Deposit so the State Controller can deposit your paycheck directly into your bank account. Your check goes promptly and directly into your bank account without you making a trip to the bank. Paper check stubs continue to be provided to employees with Direct Deposit.

If you are sick you should not be coming to work for any reason, including picking up your paycheck and, of course, you don't want to be standing in line with sick people at your bank either. Here are a few safety tips you can use on campus and in your daily activities.

- Use common sense. Be aware of your surroundings and other people who are around you.
- Pay particular attention when using a cell phone or iPod.
- Park in a well lit area.
- Scan the area before you walk to your car.
- Have your car keys in your hand before you get to your car.
- Protect your personal information online, on your cell phone, and in social networking sites. Do not share information that you would not feel comfortable sharing with the entire world.
- Never arrange a private meeting with a person you have met online.
- Know the various locations of the campus' Emergency Phones.
- When you are inside a classroom or building, identify all potential escape routes.
- In the event you are unable to leave the classroom/building, consider safe locations within the room (under tables or desks, utility closets, etc.)
- Enter the CI Police Department number into your cell phone: 437-8444, and call us if we can be of any assistance.
