The John Spoor Broome Library is proud to announce the winners of the 2010-2011 Student Book Collection Contest:



Every Tuesday, CI staff, faculty and students who subscribe to Underwood Family Farms (UFF) Community Support Agriculture (CSA) program receive a box of delicious, locally grown, seasonal vegetables and fruits. The program runs throughout the year with three types of payment plans and different box sizes to accommodate your household and eating habits.

Active CSA members receive free admission to the farm for the length of their membership, access to the recipe blog and product community area on the Web site, periodic e-newsletters with updates from the farm, and a 50% discount on the Fall Harvest Festival weekend admission price. Quarterly and semi-annual members can also attend a private tour of the farm. Boxes are delivered to El Dorado Hall every Tuesday at 1:00 p.m. and are supervised until 2:00 p.m.


