
Providing Student Access: Selected Facts

- 6,200 state supported Fall 2015 student headcount
 - 140 Recruitment visit to 34 high schools and 8 community colleges
 - 74 Recruited at local, regional and national events/fairs
 - 27 Articulation agreements with institutions representing 87% of transcripts received
- 8,927 Number of campus tour visitors
- 19,996 Undergraduate applications received
 - 1,944 New students
- 14,275 Financial aid applications received
- 4,982 Financial aid awards
 - \$12,413 Average financial aid awarded
 - \$61.7M Financial Aid awarded




