

Apply

Applications are open twice a year:

 FALL: applicants must complete requirements by the end of the spring

October 1st – November 30th

 SPRING: applicants must complete requirements by the end of summer

August 1st – August 31st

Website to apply is **www.calstate.edu/apply**LATE APPLICATIONS ARE NOT ACCEPTED

- \$55.00 application fee for the application
- Admission decision based on self-reported information from application



Transfer Requirements

- 60 transferable semester units or 90 quarter units from a regionally accredited institution.
- Minimum 2.0 GPA in all transferable units completed.
- Be in good standing at the last college or university attended.
- Complete the following classes with a grade of C- or better:
 - AI. Oral communication
 - A2. Written communication
 - A3. Critical thinking
 - B4. College-level mathematics/quantitative reasoning*

*College Algebra is acceptable for the math requirement if it is considered a GE math course at the transfer institution

Exceptions for Veterans

- Minimum 40 transferable semester units
- Minimum 2.0 GPA
- Be in good standing at the last college or university attended.
- Complete the following classes with grade of C- or better:

A2: Written communication

A3: Critical thinking

B4: College-level math/quantitative reasoning*

*College Algebra is acceptable for the math requirement if it is considered a GE math course at the transfer institution



Appeal Process

Veteran applicants that do not meet the **standard** transfer requirements will be required to submit an admissions appeal

In-progress Transcripts

In-progress transcripts must have completed coursework prior to spring 2017 posted

- Can be mailed or hand delivered but must be official and sealed when received
- It is your responsibility to order transcripts
- Faxed transcripts, printouts, and emails are not accepted

In-progress Transcript Deadline:

Monday May 1, 2017





Associate Degrees for Transfer

- CI will allow students to submit verification until
 May I
- If you reported an ADT on the application, you do not need to send verification form
- Official transcripts count as verification

Q: What if I reported that I would be earning an ADT but that is no longer the case?

A: An ADT is not an admission requirement. As long as you will meet the basic admission requirements at the end of spring 2017, you will not be affected.

Step I:Accept our Offer of Admission

Step 2: Pay the \$50 Orientation Fee

- Non-refundable
- Deferment available based on FAFSA EFC

Step 3: Register for Orientation

ALL 3 STEPS ARE REQUIRED TO SECURE A SPOT AT CI FOR FALL 2017






Final Transcripts

When to Register

- Registration occurs after Orientation
- Students must attend Orientation in order to register
- Holds that prevent registration are placed on students who do not attend
- Enrollment appointments and any holds will appear in your Student Center





Pre-requisites

- If you have not met a pre-requisite, you will receive an enrollment error
- Review course descriptions ahead of time
- Final transcript may be needed
 - Cannot post in progress coursework to your record
- Review transfer credit report
- Plan ahead All transfer coursework will be evaluated before the start of your first term, but not before you register


Preparing to Transfer to CI

Getting Ahead in Summer

- What should I take to get ahead in Summer?
 - American Institutions
 - Language other than English
 - Multicultural Requirement



These are not necessarily covered by IGETC!



Remember, you can transfer a maximum of 70 units from a community college

Academic Advising

- When can I meet with an academic advisor?
 - During Orientation and once semester begins
- What can I expect at Orientation with regard to advising and registration?
 - Contact with both faculty and professional academic advisors
 - Advising model at CI
 - Suggestions for first semester courses
 - Explanation of all degree requirements
 - Date and time of your registration



First Semester Courses

- What courses should I take my first semester?
 - Two to three major courses
 - UDIGE
 - Any remaining university requirements (foreign language, American history, etc.)



Resources for Transition

- What resources/help is available for the transition to CI?
 - UNIV 300 (I unit) University Life/College Success
 - UNIV 349 (3 units) Transfer Year
 Seminar





Time to Graduation

- How long will it take me to graduate?
 - Total units needed to graduate 120
 - Most transfer enter with 70 so you'll need at least 50
 - In most cases your major is NOT 50 units so you will need electives
 - So how long? 50 units in four semester is an average of 12.5 units per semester
