**OSHA workplace safety guidance:** OSHA has divided workplaces and work operations into risk zones, according to the likelihood of employees' occupational exposure during a pandemic. For Non-HCP, the risk zones identified below are useful in determining appropriate work practices and precautions.

## Lower Exposure Risk:

- Employees who have minimal occupational contact with the general public and other coworkers (such as office employees).
- <u>Administrative Controls</u>
  - Maintain a distance of at least 6 feet
- <u>Personal Protective Equipment:</u>
  - o Additional PPE is not recommended for workers in the lower exposure risk group.
  - Workers should continue to use the PPE, if any, that they would ordinarily use for other job tasks.

## Medium Exposure Risk:

- Employees with high-frequency contact with the general population (such as schools, high density work environments).
- <u>Administrative Controls:</u>
  - Minimize face-to-face contact
  - Maintain a distance of at least 6 feet
- <u>Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):</u>
  - During an outbreak of an infectious disease, such as COVID-19, recommendations for PPE specific to occupations
    or job tasks include: gloves, goggles, face shields, face masks, and respiratory protection, when appropriate.
