


# Student Ratings of Teaching (SRT)

## How do I access the SRT Site to complete the online evaluations?


Students may access the Student Ratings of Teaching (SRT) site via *myCI*.

1. Go to <https://myci.csuci.edu>.
2. Enter your Dolphin Name and Password.
3. Click the “Sign In” button.


4. Click on the “Student Ratings of Teaching” link in the *My Links* module.





- 9) I was able to effectively use instructor feedback to increase my learning.

6. Proceed to complete the survey by selecting the appropriate radio button for each question.
7. You may save progress at anytime by clicking the "Save Progress" button located at the end of each section.
8. You may also choose to exit the survey for completion at a later time by clicking the "Save Progress and Return to Survey List" button at the bottom of the survey.
9. Once finished, click the "Submit Survey" button at the bottom of the survey.

10. A prompt will ask if you are sure you want to submit the survey. Click “Cancel” if you would like to go back to review your responses. Click “OK” if you are finished and understand that you will not be able to redo the survey.




11. If you skipped a question, you will be prompted to complete all required questions. Click “OK” to continue.



12. Click the “Submit Survey” button after making sure you have responded to all questions.  
13. Once completed, a confirmation will pop up indicating that your submission has been saved. Click “OK” to proceed.



You will then be taken back to the survey home page where you may evaluate other courses that are available, view a list of completed and incomplete surveys, or Log Out of the application. Repeat process as needed to complete all evaluations available to you.
