

Why Summer College?

College Credit: Earn credit that may later be transferred or applied when you are accepted into a university degree program.

College Environment: Learn about California State University Channel Islands (CSUCI) college majors and programs of study in the Career Exploration Seminars. Seminars include presentations by University faculty and speakers from the community proving real word connections to academic programs covering a wide range of careers and programs. Classes are offered in historic Spanish-style buildings on the campus of California State University Channel Islands. Additional sessions cover the University's library, computer labs, and the CSU application process.

Prepare for Success: In order to succeed in both entering and completing college, students must have strong writing and speaking skills. Additionally, good study habits are essential. This program uses specially trained faculty and tutors help students solidify the skills necessary for them to do well in any college program of study.

Summer College at California State University Channel

Summer College is a special program sponsored by the Oxnard Union High School District Migrant Education program designed to encourage high school students to attend college. The unique summer program includes language and study skills assistance, career and academic discipline exploration to a three-credit college course. Field trips to local sites give students a lively hands-on way to interact with the course content.
