CHOOSING OUR THEME

- CSUCI-wide survey distributed fall 2021 with quantitative and qualitative questions;
- 8 focus groups conducted spring 2022 to narrow results;
- 2 padlets with questions from the focus groups;
- Meetings of the advisory committee, which included representation from stakeholder groups;
- Feedback shared via email and Academic Senate updates and announcements.
- Theme/ priorities presented to the President's Cabinet, Academic Affairs Council, Senate Executive Committee, Staff Council, & student government, along with forums for faculty, staff, and students in April 2022.



REAFFIRMATION STEERING COMMITTEE

CHARGE:

- Deliver universitywide framework for student success;
- Plan and conduct the TPR self-study in collaboration with campus partners;
- Gather input, feedback, and reflection from campus stakeholders;
- Drafts various components of CSUCI's institutional report.

GALLERY TOURS, SPRING 2023

- 221 faculty, staff, students & administrators participated;
- Nearly 1500 comments submitted for RSC review;
- Participants rated each priority within the theme on a scale of 1-4; average rating between somewhat and very strong (3.24 of 4);
- Between 85% and 88% of respondents rated each priority and overall theme, respectively, as somewhat or very strong.



STUDENT SUCCESS BROWN BAGS

- Approximately 100 stakeholder participants;
- About 1/3 of tour respondents also attended a brown bag in advance of the tour;
- 91% of tour participants said the student success framework aligned with what they think it should be at CSUCI;
- Feedback from sessions used to refine framework and submit Senate resolution;
- Senate Resolution approved December 2023.

GALLERY TOURS, FALL 2023

- 192 faculty, staff, students & administrators participated;
- Participants rated the level of accuracy of the RSC's work on a 4-point scale; average response was 3.5 of 4, between somewhat and very accurate;
- 94% of participants said information provided across 3 priorities represented work & activities across campus;
- 97% said information provided was comprehensive;
- 89% said priorities make a strong case for our gaps & ladders/brechas y escaleras theme.
