DASS assists CSUCI students with disabilities by providing a wide range of support services.





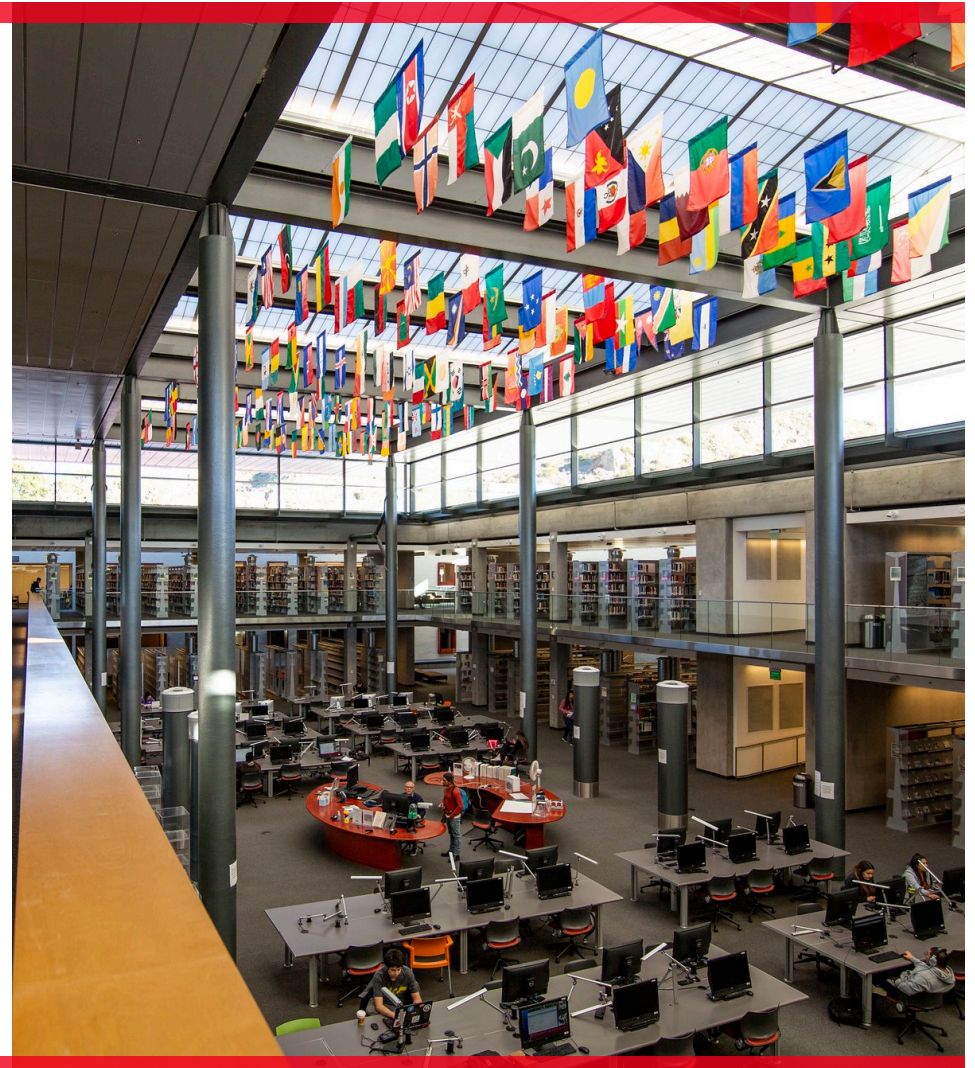


## Services DASS Provides

- Support programs

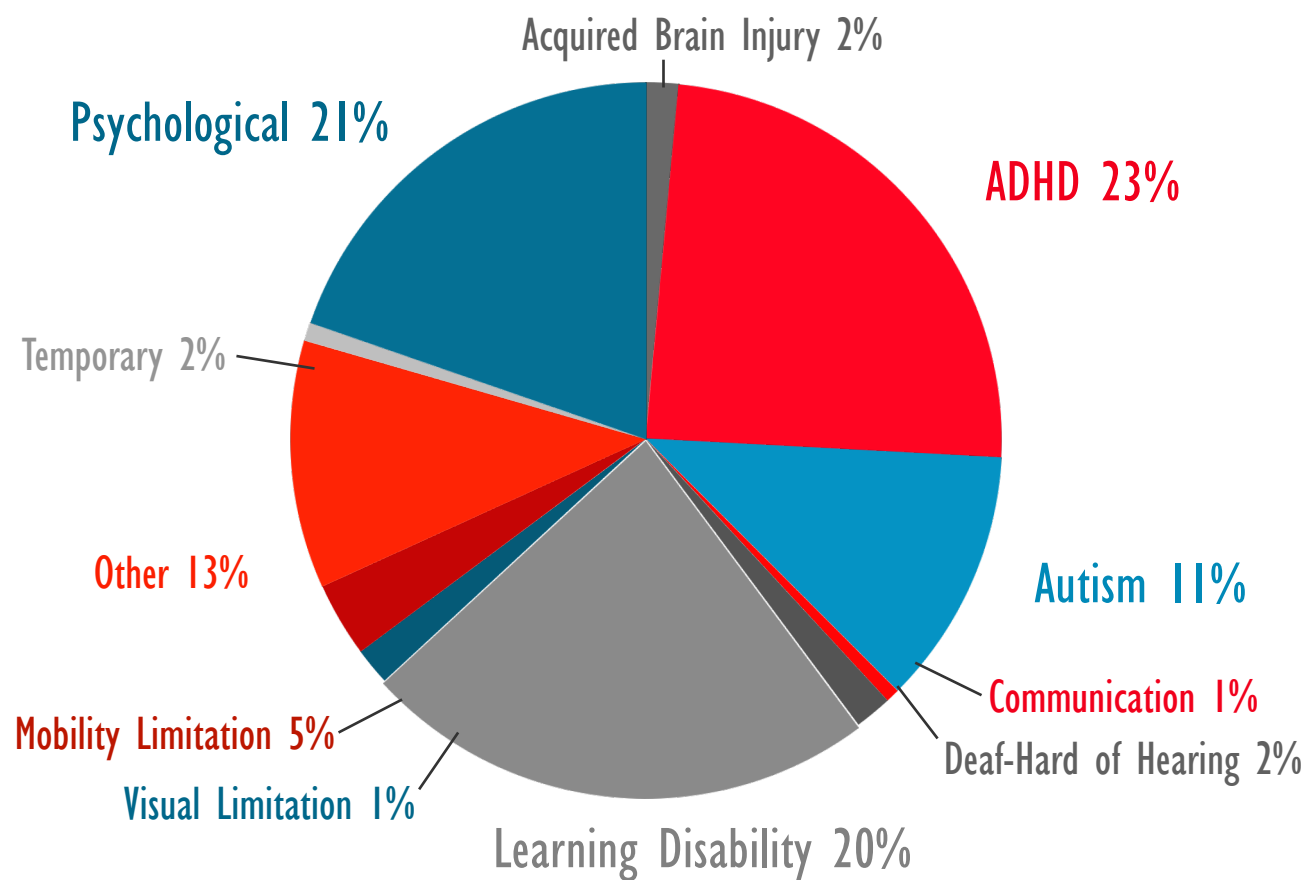
## Students are eligible if...

- they complete on-line application & the new student appointment process

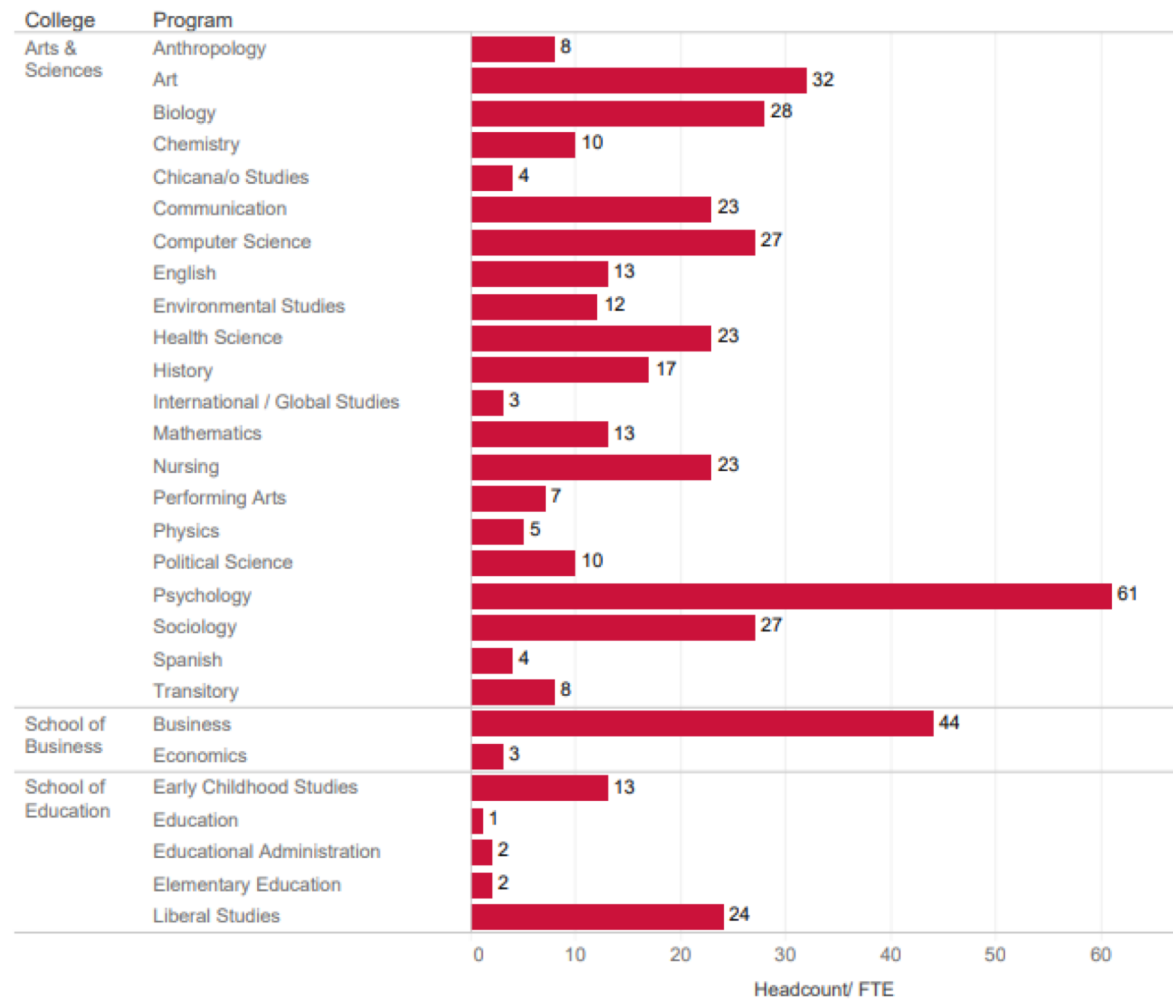

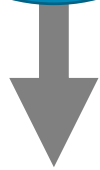

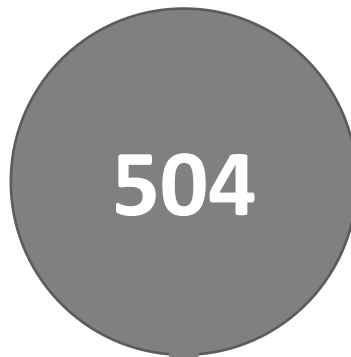

## CSU Standards

- The CSU has the right to maintain admission, academic, and conduct standards.
- A reasonable accommodation cannot result in a fundamental alteration to an academic program, course or activity.
- **The learning outcome of a course cannot be altered.**

## Do Accommodations Transfer?

**Sometimes.**

### Usually Transfer

- Extended time on exams
- Alternative media
- Assistive technology
- Notetaking
- Lecture recording
- ASL interpreter
- Braille documents
- Computer for essay exams

### Sometimes Transfer

- Extra absences
- More time on assignments
- Calculator on exams
- Alternative assignment
- Spell check on exams

### Do Not Transfer

- Shortened assignments
- Notes on exams
- Alternative grading
- Specialized instruction
