



# INTENT TO ENROLL STEPS

To reserve your space for fall 2020, you must complete a three-step Intent to Enroll process no later than Friday, May 1, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. Our offer of provisional admission is only valid for the fall 2020 term. You may not defer your enrollment to a later semester. Our offer of provisional admission will be withdrawn if you fail to complete all three steps of the Intent to Enroll process, as described below, by the deadline.

- Accept our offer of provisional admission; AND
- 2. Choose a mandatory orientation session; AND
- 3. Pay the \$50 non-refundable orientation fee.

The above three steps must be completed by Friday, May 1, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. in your <u>myCl</u> (<u>myci.csuci.edu</u>), student portal. Follow these instructions:

- Start by logging into your myCl and clicking on "Cl Records." Your login information was sent to the email address you provided on your application.
- Once logged in, scroll down to the bottom of the page (under "Admissions") and "Accept" or "Decline" admission.
  - » Note: A yellow triangle will appear in your Student Center after you submit your intent to enroll. You can ignore the triangle, but you must pay close attention to items on your To Do List.
- After accepting our offer of admission, you are now ready to register for a mandatory orientation session. Look for the link, "Register for Island View Orientation (IVO)."You will be directed to log back into your myCl student portal in order to register for the session that pertains to your major.
  - » IMPORTANT: If you do not receive an email confirmation, then you did not successfully register. Retain a copy of your confirmation.
- After registering for an orientation session, you must complete the final step in the Intent to Enroll process: pay the non-refundable orientation fee by the deadline above. It is highly recommended that you pay the orientation fee before logging out. If you log out prior to submitting payment, you will need to use the payment link embedded in your myCl Student Center. To get there, log on to myCl and click on "Cl Records" under "My Links." For detailed instructions, visit go.csuci.edu/orientationpayment.
  - » IMPORTANT: Be sure to enter your preferred email address. You will receive an email confirmation if your payment was successfully received. If you do not receive an email, then your payment was not received. Save a copy of your confirmation email as it may be necessary to prove payment.

#### Can I defer payment of the orientation fee?

That depends. Deferment means that payment of the orientation fee will be charged to your fall semester's account. If you are eligible for a deferment, you will find it noted in your <u>myCl</u> Student Center under "Holds" (visible in the upper-right corner of your portal).

Students who filed a 2020-2021 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the California Dream application on or before the March 2, 2020 deadline **AND** have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of 4,000 or less will be considered for a deferment; however, not all students will qualify. You must check the "Holds" section of your Student Center. If you do not see reference to the deferral in the "Holds" section, then you must pay the fee by Friday, May 1, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. or our offer of admission will be withdrawn – no exceptions!

#### Is the orientation fee refundable?

Once paid, the orientation fee is non-refundable and may not be applied to a future term. This means you will NOT receive a refund even if (a) you request to have our offer of admission (provisional or final) withdrawn at a later date or choose not to enroll; (b) our offer of provisional admission is withdrawn because you failed to meet an admission or enrollment requirement or deadline (including the transcript deadline); or (c) our offer of provisional admission is rescinded after reviewing your final transcript(s).

- » IMPORTANT: You may be held responsible for paying the orientation fee if you were deferred and any of the above conditions apply.
- » NOTE: You may submit an orientation-fee appeal to <u>orientation@csuci.edu</u>; however, you must have an extenuating circumstance for it to be approved.

# **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS - IMPORTANT REMINDER**

Our offer of provisional admission was based on information you provided on your CSU admissions application. For you to maintain your admitted status and enroll at CSUCI in fall 2020, you must have by the conclusion of the spring 2020 semester:

- Completed a minimum of 60-transferable semester units (90 quarter units);
- Earned at least a 2.0 GPA in your transferable coursework;
- Been in good standing at the last institution attended; AND
- Completed the "Golden Four" basic skills courses with a grade of "C-" or better:

A1. Oral Communication

A2. Written Communication

A3. Critical Thinking

B4. Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning

IMPORTANT: Coursework taken in summer 2020 CANNOT be used to fulfill admission requirements for fall 2020.

Students who earn a California Community College Transfer Associates Degree (SB 1440), also known as AA-T or AS-T, must send us a final transcript showing the degree as being "awarded" in order for the degree to be noted in their CSUCI records. (An AA-T/AS-T is <u>not</u> required to be admitted to CSUCI.) This should be done ASAP after earning your AA-T or AS-T. You are still required to submit your final official transcript by the July 1, 2020 transcript deadline even if your AA-T/AS-T degree has not been posted on your community college transcript. When your AA-T/AS-T degree is awarded by your community college, you must send another official transcript to CSUCI in order for the AA-T/AS-T degree to be noted on your record at CSUCI.

# RESIDENCY FOR CSUTUITION PURPOSES

Residency status determines what tuition fees you will be charged for your classes. On your admission letter, your residency status for CSU Tuition Purposes is indicated. California residency for tuition purposes eligibility criteria are established by state law and the California Code of Regulations. Your residency was determined based upon self reported information you provided on your Cal State Apply application. Please review your residency status on your admission letter.

Residency Status	Tuition & Fees
California Resident	Qualifies for CA Resident Tuition & Fees
Another State or US Possession	Qualifies for Non-Resident Tuition & Fees
Undetermined	Defaults to Non-Resident Tuition & Fees

For information on tuition rates, please visit: go.csuci.edu/fees. If you feel your residency status for CSU Tuition Purposes is incorrect, you may request for a residency reclassification. Information regarding residency and what documents to submit is available at: go.csuci.edu/CAresidency. The priority deadline to submit your residency documents to have them reviewed prior to when tuition is due is July 13, 2020. Those who submit their documents after the deadline, or submit incomplete documents, may not have them processed in time for the fall 2020 term.

# **IMPORTANT DATES AND DEADLINES**

### Tuesday, Oct. 1, 2019

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the <u>California Dream (CADAA)</u> application opens for the 2020-2021 award year.

### Monday, March 2, 2020

Priority filing deadline for the Free Application for <u>Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u> and the <u>California Dream (CADAA)</u> application opens for the 2020-2021 award year.

#### Friday, May 1, 2020 - 11:59 p.m.

Deadline for admitted students to confirm their Intent to Enroll at CSUCI. Reserve a space for fall 2020 by completing the online three-step Intent to Enroll process. (See the reverse side for further instructions.)

### Monday, May 18, 2020

Information about campus housing and how to apply for fall 2020 can be found at go.csuci.edu/housing.

On-campus housing is guaranteed to all new students that apply for housing by the priority deadline of May 18. Transfers applying late for on-campus housing are typically assigned to Santa Cruz Village on a space-available basis.

#### Tuesday, May 31, 2020

Fall 2020 Financial Aid priority document deadline. Please refer to your "To Do" list for documents that are required.

#### Wednesday, July 1, 2020 - 5:00 p.m.

Deadline to submit Advanced Placement (AP) and CLEP exam scores. If you took AP exams in high school or College Level Examination Program (CLEP) exams, you must request that your official scores be sent to us directly from the College Board by this deadline (unless you have already done so).

\*AP/CLEP credit awarded from your transferring institution will not suffice. Exams scores taken four or more years require additional processing time. Please plan accordingly. Request scores at least 6-8 weeks in advance.

#### Wednesday, July 1, 2020 - 5:00 p.m.

Deadline for CSUCI to receive your final official transcript(s) with spring 2020 grades posted. Transcripts must be requested from all colleges attended even if no credit was earned. Electronic transcripts are preferred. It's your responsibility to request official transcripts from all community colleges and/or universities attended (even if course credit is reflected on another school's transcript) and have them submitted by the deadline. Your admission will be withdrawn if all transcripts are not received by the deadline. No email or faxes are allowed. Please mail transcripts to:

Note: If you have taken coursework from an institution outside of the United States, your transcript must be evaluated by a credentials evaluation service, such as International Education Research Foundation (IERF) at <a href="https://www.ierf.org">www.ierf.org</a>. Request your official report at least 6-8 weeks in advance of the transcript deadline.
