When Jordan Ball isn't busy with his job as a Regional Representative for U.S. Senator Bob Casey (Pa.) or pursuing his M.B.A. in Energy Finance at West Virginia University, he likes to channel his inner James Corden, star of The Late, Late Show's "Carpool Karaoke."

"I love to sing in the car and play carpool karaoke with my friends – especially on road trips," says Ball. Both sides of his family hail from the area, and most extended family members are either coal miners or their jobs depend on the industry.

"I have such a strong affinity for coal country," he says. "It feels great to give a voice to people and communities that have been historically disenfranchised and displaced by automation, globalization and other economic factors."

Ball, who also serves as Co-Director of the Pittsburgh New Leaders Council and has been recognized as a leading regional influencer, says his greatest accomplishment, thus far, is a speech he gave to national leaders in Washington, D.C. He says he hopes to represent his region as an elected official someday.
