PLEASE EXPLAIN (1) DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY; (2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S); AND (3) WHAT YOU LEARNED FROM THE PROCESS.

1.) THIS CONCERT/LECTURE/DEMONSTRATION PRESENTED TWO MUSICIANS WHO PLAY THE SITAR AND TABLA INSTRUMENTS FROM INDIA.

2.) MY WORLD MUSIC CLASS HAD JUST FINISHED LEARNING ABOUT THE MUSIC OF INDIA, SO THIS WAS AN EXCELLENT OPPORTUNITY FOR OUR STUDENTS TO SEE THESE INSTRUMENTS PLAYED LIVE AND IN PERSON. THE GUEST ARTISTS GAVE CLEAR, UNDERSTANDABLE EXPLANATIONS ABOUT THE INDIAN MUSICAL FORMS, RHYTHM, AND MELODIES THEY WERE NEGOTIATING. STUDENT COMMENTS about WORLD MUSIC CONCERT – 10/19/2013

The instruments from India that were performed for our class were eye opening and well appreciated. Hearing the sitar over a recording does not fully reflect the magnificent sound it makes. Most of the individuals, including myself have never seen or heard a sitar in person until now. The same is true for the tabla, as well as the Indian flute. The tabla has its own language that transcends a raga's unique style. Before this performance my exposure to these instruments was limited, if not inexistent. This raga performance was an experience I was fortunate to be a part of. It allowed me to be exposed to instruments I would not otherwise have experienced.

The classical Indian musical performances in our class by Paul Livingstone and Neelamjit Dhillon were amazing and we were very fortunate to be able to see what we have been discussing in class come to real life. These two musicians gave a very intimate performance in which they played classical Indian music instruments and explained to us some of the important elements involved.

Paul Livingstone was a wonderful performer and gave us a lot of insight and clarification about classical Indian music, including sharing his journey as a musician and sitar player. We learned that Livingstone moved to India when he was 15 to pursue his love of Indian music and was trained by Ravi Shankar.

Neelamjit Dhillon certainly caught our attention. He engaged with us as an audience and made us feel like we were very much a part of the music.

Everything that the musicians said about the music was a great clarification of what we have learned in class and brought the course material to life. I feel fortunate to have seen this performance.

Overall, the concert was very entertaining and educational. Paul and Neelamjit have such great chemistry together and you can really feel the energy in their music.

The concert was both entertaining and informative. The two performers demonstrated their vast knowledge of the instruments and the musical genre. This was an entertaining and educational experience that should be standard for every semester. This concert allowed me to get up close with the instruments to see and hear the fine details each one brings. The explanations that the performers provided were very insightful. I would highly recommend attending these concerts to gain a new insight into music.

The tabla player was truly incredible. His speed was what was most apparently impressive about his playing style, when he played its was a sight to be beheld. The way he moved his hands in such a fast paced and graceful way was astonishing.

The link between the tabla drums and how they vocalize the tabla sounds was also demonstrated. As Neel explained, one learns to play the tabla by learning simple words that sound like the tones of the tabla drums. So he would be trying to emulate what the guru would speak to him. Over all it was a wonderful concert.

It was rather fascinating being able to experience this traditional Indian musical concert in person. There was a sense of great feeling and improvisation in this music that I had never felt in other genres of music before. The performers of the concert were Paul Livingstone, a sitar player, and Neelamjit Dhillon, a tabla and flute player. While the music was incredible to be part of, it was the lesson both players gave the audience that was the real treat.

Overall, I have to say that this was a memorable experience and would not mind having them come in again. I believe having these kind of performances really helps the class learn by a live experience. It gives the viewer a better understanding of how the instrument is being played and what it sounds like when demonstrated in an in-class performance.

As we have just recently covered Indian music, traditional and modern, Hindustani and Karnatic, it was very educational to see it performed live and explained by people who have mastered the music. My understanding of Indian music has increased immensely from this experience.

The most deep, personal, and meaningful lesson I learned from the entire performance, was at the end when Paul Livingstone was asked why he chose to study Indian music. He began telling us about his influences of George Harrison of The Beatles, then of Ravi Shankar, and then he began to share his experience of when he moved to India and eventually was able to study the sitar in the hands of Ravi Shankar. When a guru accepts a student, the student accepts responsibility as a student and serves the teacher. It is an agreed-upon, lifelong relationship of guru teaching student. So contrary to the Western ways of teaching, I believe this way of educating is so beautiful and exceptional, especially in teaching music, which I believe is so inherent and intricately woven into human culture.

Overall the experience was a fresh and exciting one. Both Paul and Neelamjit has absolutely beautiful and radiant personalities which made my first time seeing a sitar play with a table accompaniment one of the best I could ever imagine! I was truly lucky to be a part of this experience.

As the concert came to an end, we both felt blessed to be able to view this spectacle of a long and beautiful tradition. I was very impressed by Paul and Neel's dedication to this music as well as by their level of excellence. The opportunity for educational growth is greatly enhanced by performances such as this one. To have an exposure to the culture behind a kind of music, art or other artistic endeavor makes all the difference in the validity and meaning of learning for students. It brings us one-to-one into a meaningful connection with the subject of our study encouraging tolerance and appreciation for the world's cultures. In turn, this encourages continued higher learning.

There were points when my jaw dropped to the floor during this concert. Not only did these musical artists perform, but they enlightened the entire class about their instruments, the musical forms being used, and involved the audience by showing us how to count and clap the main accents in a 16 beat tintal tala rhythm. Hands down, these were some of the best musicians I have ever seen. Overall, the concert was just sensational. It took my mind to a state of well being, and made me feel things I've never felt when listening to other types of music. Both musicians were excellent, and yet were so genuine. So much can be taken from Indian music. I was glad to have been a part of this amazing experience.
