PLEASE EXPLAIN (1) DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY;

This live music presentation was part of our World Music concert series for my PAMU 332 World Music class. This concert featured Mr. Amadou Fall, a kora (African harp) musician from the country of Senegal, in western Africa. This was the first time that a kora player has ever come to CSUCI to perform. Mr. Fall performed many traditional songs during our class, and he also explained the meanings of those songs to the class.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S);

IN MY PAMU 332 WORLD MUSIC COURSE, WE SPEND A LOT OF TIME LEARNING ABOUT THE KORA, AND WHY IT IS THE MOST CULTURALLY SIGNIFICANT INSTRUMENT IN THE WEST AFRICAN MUSICAL TRADITION. THIS WAS AN OUTSTANDING OPPORTUNITY FOR OUR STUDENTS TO EXPERIENCE THE MAGICAL SOUNDS OF THE KORA IN REAL LIFE. STUDENT FEEDBACK INDICATES THAT OUR STUDENTS CONSIDERED THIS EVENT TO BE VERY HELPFUL FOR THEM, AND THAT THEY REALLY ENJOYED THIS MUSICAL EXPERIENCE. ALSO ATTENDING THIS EVENT WERE VISITING STUDENTS AND PROFESSORS FROM OTHER COURSES.

AND (3) WHAT YOU LEARNED FROM THE PROCESS.

I WAS INITIALLY WORRIED THAT AN ENTIRE **75** MINUTES OF KORA MUSIC (AND SPOKEN SEGEMENTS) WOULD BE TOO MUCH OF THE SAME SOUND FOR OUR STUDENTS. BUT THEIR FEEDBACK (WHICH IS ATTACHED) SHOWS THAT THE STUDENTS HAD NO SUCH PROBLEM. TO MY SURPRISE, THIS EVENT RECEIVED EXTREMELY POSITIVE FEEDBACK FROM THE STUDENTS. THE KORA IS SO MUCH BETTER EXPERIENCED IN PERSON, AS OPPOSED TO YOU-TUBE CLIPS. SO WE WILL DEFINITELY INVITE AMADOU FALL TO TO RETURN TO CSUCI TO PERFORM FOR US IN FUTURE SEMESTERS.

He was humble, very happy to be performing, and eager to show us his world. He came in traditional dress, a light blue outfit with gold trim. I imagined that this would really enhance the concert. He wasn't in street clothes. Instead, he chose to give us the full experience, wearing the traditional outfit that a kora player would. This really helped my understanding of the music. Amadou playing the kora goes beyond a musician playing his instrument. It's something you embody.

The music itself was amazing. Each song having its own separate meaning was very deep! I did like how each song came with its own explanation of why they played it. It really gave new meaning to each piece of music as we were able to understand the mood set by the music and where each song got its emotional content.

I thought the performance was a great experience that will having a lasting effect on my view of music. One reason I wanted to take this class was to get an overview of instruments around the world so I could incorporate them into my own music and the kora is definitely something I would like to incorporate somehow. I had high hopes coming into the performance and it didn't disappoint.

On Monday, March 3, Amadou Fall, an African kora player, performed for our class. The event was quite eye opening and very interesting. Being a musician, I really enjoyed seeing someone play an instrument so unfamiliar to me, explaining its meaning, and also seeing someone who was raised in a completely different culture than my own.

Overall, the concert was very enlightening and impressive. Amadou Fall was extremely kind and, without a doubt, one of the best musicians I have ever seen live. At the end of his performance, he opened up the floor for questions. I am very thankful for the in-class performances that CSUCI presents to myself, and to the whole student body. Of all the concerts I have attended on campus, this was one of my favorites. I hope that there are many more to come!

I really enjoyed the Amadou Fall kora concert. It was a very interesting musical and cultural experience; it was a musicultural experience. Amadou was a dynamic musician and an intriguing personality. Not only did he play for us, but he spoke to us about the kora, the music, and his West African culture. He also took the time to answer questions.

I found the whole experience to be humbling and inspiring. I appreciated that he spoke to us about his spiritual beliefs—it helped me gain some perspective and reflect about life and the world we live in; how there is so much diversity in our world. I had never met anyone from West Africa. Overall, I thoroughly enjoyed the concert experience. It was wonderful to hear him play and listen to him speak. He provided so much valuable insight not only into his music and instrument, but his life and culture as well. I expected it to be great and it was even better. It helped to solidify many of the broader concepts and specific information that we have learned in class. If Amadou Fall were performing locally, I would pay to see him again. I am grateful for the experience and I look forward to the next one!

Amadou then played a song that he dedicated to all mothers. He began to talk about how everything begins and ends with women. He spoke of how we should all be thankful to our mothers and always respect all women for what they do. This was my favorite part of the performance even though it was not initially represented by music until after his speech. He played a couple more songs after that and all were exceptionally great.

The music's cultural roots were being expressed during the performance through the words he said in between songs. I felt truly touched by what he had to say and the songs represented his culture's viewpoints. The concert was well attended and most of the listeners were not members of a similar ethnic group. All in all, I really enjoyed this amazing performance by Amadou and I am so incredibly thankful I was able to see this.

As someone who has never been out of the country, this concert was somewhat of a culture shock to me. To be able to experience this music, and in such an intimate setting, is an opportunity that I can really appreciate. Between songs, Amadou would explain that many of the songs were very personal and spiritual. When the kora is played, it's like healing the heart. The third song was one about sharing and probably my favorite song played during the concert. I can really welcome the fact that Amadou explained that in his culture, they realize that life doesn't last forever and therefore they choose to enjoy it. That story inspired me to want to live my life to its fullest potential. During the concert, not only did I experience music from a different culture, but I welcomed that fact that Amadou attributed life lessons through his music and has seen the kora as a gift that has taken him all over the world.

My overall experience was not only the incredible music and the unique instrument, it was Amadou. He has so many layers, that all unfolded into a beautiful person. I have learned that the kora is more than an instrument for this man; it is a spiritual practice. I very greatly enjoyed the concert and I will never forget it.
