PLEASE EXPLAIN (1) DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY:

THIS ACTIVITY WAS A LIVE JAZZ MUSIC CONCERT ON CAMPUS FOR OUR **PAMU 330** "JAZZ IN AMERICA" CLASS. OTHER CI STUDENTS ALSO ATTENDED THIS EVENT. THIS CONCERT FEATURED PROFESSIONAL VOCALIST WENDY SMITH-BRUNÉ. WENDY IS A HIGHLY SKILLED LOS ANGELES BASED SINGER. HER EXTENSIVE RESUMÉ INCLUDES SEVERAL YEARS OF PERFORMING AND TOURING WITH THE LEGENDARY RAY CHARLES. FOR THIS CONCERT, WE ALSO FEATURED OTHER MUSICAL GUESTS: A DRUMMER, BASSIST, AND A PIANIST. ALL OF OUR GUESTS FOR THIS EVENT ARE BUSY PROFESSIONAL MUSICIANS IN LOS ANGELES/ HOLLYWOOD.

This event was also connected to African American Heritage Week at CI. With that theme in mind, Wendy took the audience on a tour of jazz music classics that were made famous by African American singers such as Billie Holiday, Ella Fitzgerald, Natalie Cole, and Big Mama Thornton. Wendy also engaged our students in some scat singing exchanges, which were fun for everyone.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S):

THIS ACTIVITY RELATED DIRECTLY TO THE SUBJECT MATTER THAT IS TAUGHT IN OUR PAMU 330 "JAZZ IN AMERICA" COURSE. I HAD ALREADY EXPOSED MY STUDENTS TO THE SINGING STYLES OF BILLIE HOLIDAY AND ELLA FITZGERALD BY WAY OF YOU-TUBE VIDEOS AND AUDIO RECORDINGS. HAVING A VERY EXPERIENCED PROFESSIONAL VOCALIST PERFORM THE REPERTOIRE OF THOSE LEGENDARY SINGERS FOR OUR STUDENTS - REALLY BROUGHT THE MUSIC TO LIFE FOR THE STUDENTS, AND ADDED TO THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF THIS GREAT MUSICAL TRADITION. THIS LIVE PERFORMANCE ALSO CORRELATED TO THE MUSICAL PERFORMANCE PRINCIPLES THAT ARE TAUGHT IN OUR PAMU 109 AND 309 PRIVATE MUSIC LESSON COURSES, OUR MUSIC THEORY COURSES, AND THE C.I. CONTEMPORARY MUSIC ENSEMBLE COURSE. THIS EXPOSITION OF GREAT AFRICAN AMERICAN MUSIC ALSO RELATED TO THE CONTENT THAT IS TAUGHT IN OTHER C.I. MUSIC HISTORY COURSES, SUCH AS HIST/PAMU 337: MUSIC IN HISTORY, AND PAMU 200: HISTORY OF ROCK.

I ALSO HAD MY STUDENTS WRITE A 1,000 WORD REPORT ABOUT WHAT THEY OBSERVED AND LEARNED AT THIS CONCERT. THAT EXERCISE CONTRIBUTES TO OUR CAMPUS WIDE GOAL OF "WRITING ACROSS THE CURRICULUM", WHICH WILL HOPEFULLY RESULT IN OUR STUDENTS ACQUIRING BETTER WRITING SKILLS.

AND (3) WHAT YOU LEARNED FROM THE PROCESS.

I LEARNED THAT OUR STUDENTS REALLY ENJOY SEEING A GREAT VOCALIST PERFORM FOR THEM. THE STUDENTS HAD FUN, LEARNED A LOT, AND GOT SOME VALUABLE "HANDS ON" EXPERIENCE BY SCAT SINGING IN THE CALL-AND-REPSONSE SINGING THAT WENDY TOOK THEM THROUGH.

I LEARNED FROM THE STUDENTS' VERBAL AND WRITTEN FEEDBACK THAT BY ATTENDING THESE LIVE MUSIC CONCERTS, OUR STUDENTS DEVELOP A MUCH DEEPER UNDERSTANDING AND APPRECIATION FOR THIS GREAT AMERICAN MUSICAL ART FORM. MANY STUDENTS REPORT THAT THESE LIVE MUSIC CONCERTS ALLOW THEM TO MORE FULLY UNDERSTAND THE MUSICAL PRICIPLES THAT ARE BEING TAUGHT IN OUR MUSIC COURSES.

I ALSO LEARNED FROM GRADING THE STUDENT PAPERS, THAT MANY C.I. STUDENTS NEED TO WORK MUCH HARDER TO DEVELOP THEIR WRITING SKILLS. I AM STILL SEEING WAY TOO MANY EXAMPLES OF POOR WRITING SKILLS AT THIS UNIVERSITY.

ALL IN ALL, THIS CONCERT WAS A GREAT EXPERIENCE FOR ALL OF THE INVOLVED PARTIES.
