DATE (S) OF ACTIVITY: Oct. 26, 2015

(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

This activity featured a trio of highly skilled professional jazz musicians from the Los Angeles area: pianist Gary Nesteruk, drummer Sinclair Lott, and bassist Larry Steen. Those three musicians have all performed with some of the biggest names in the music business including Stevie Wonder and Aretha Franklin to name just a few. Yours truly also joined the ensemble on my saxophones. We presented classic jazz compositions that corresponded to the historical/stylistic periods that we had been studying in my PAMU 330 "Jazz in America" course.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

This performance related directly to the musical styles and composers that my PAMU 330 "Jazz In America" class had been learning about. Each of our guest musicians also demonstrated some basic jazz music techniques on their specific instrument. Students remarked that it is so helpful for them to see the techniques performed in front of them. Although DVDs and You-Tube videos are helpful classroom devices, there is nothing that compares to live in-person music demonstrations. Students also witnessed our full performances of famous jazz songs, where they observed the important interactions and non-verbal communications that occur during a jazz music performance.

Our students were also able to ask questions of our guest artists. Additionally, we had CI students from other courses and majors attending this concert to expand their cultural knowledge, listening experience, and musical knowledge.

(3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strengths of this activity were thoroughly described in the previous paragraph. To summarize, it is very important to have several in-class concerts during the semester, so the students can witness a live music demonstration, with all the necessary interaction among the band members that takes places during a performance. The individual technique demonstrations and spoken introductions about each instrument are also very important. Furthermore, we



introduced each tune with a short discussion of the song's musical form and counting scheme.

(4) WHAT WOULD YOU SAY ARE/WERE THE ACTIVITY'S WEAKNESSES?

The only weaknesses in this activity is that because of a different course being taught in that classroom prior to our performance, we only had 10 or 15 minutes to move all the band gear onto the stage and set up. It was rushed, but we made it happen!

(5) HOW WOULD YOU IMPROVE THIS ACTIVITY FOR NEXT TIME?

No improvements needed. Everything was stellar about this activity.

(6) WHAT DID YOU LEARN FROM THE PROCESS?

This event reinforced my existing knowledge that these live music performances are essential and vital for all of our music courses. Students have to be able to observe these musical traditions being performed in front of their own eyes.
