## (1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

This activity featured a pair of world famous Flamenco performers sharing their skills and perspectives about their amazing art form with our World Music class. Dancer Arleen Hurtado and guitarist Ben Woods are well known throughout the world of Flamenco music. They demonstrated several different song forms, dance techniques, and flamenco guitar techniques.

Besides the students from my World Music class, we also had students from other courses attend this event, along with several CI staff and faculty members from other departments.

# (2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

My PAMU 332 "World Music" class has been learning about Latin music styles, including Flamenco. This LIVE musical demonstration brought the sounds, sights, and concepts of Flamenco music and dance to the students via an up-close and personal experience. Our students were also able to ask questions of our guest artists. Additionally, we had CI students from other courses and majors attending this concert to expand their cultural knowledge, listening experience, and musical knowledge. Several of our guitar students also attended this event to get a look at Ben Woods' amazing guitar playing skills.

## (3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strengths of this activity include having Flamenco insiders relating the Flamenco culture to our students. As Arleen spoke of during the event, Flamenco is more than the music and dance, it is a way of life.

This was an incredible opportunity for our students to see and hear these great performers. As the students wrote on the feedback forms seen below, they really value the opportunity to watch and learn about this art form through this in person demonstration.

Another strength of this activity included the individual demonstrations of the song forms, the dancer's signals, the footwork, and the guitar techniques. Arleen also explained the Spanish and Gypsy origins of the flamenco style. Our guest also got the students personally involved by having the attendees clap along in the "palmas" rhythms of the music. All of these aspects gave our students further insights into this music.



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(4) WHAT WOULD YOU SAY ARE/WERE THE ACTIVITY'S WEAKNESSES? I saw no weaknesses in this activity. This event was very high-level and excellent in every way. Our two guests are very good at demonstrating and explaining the components of their music and dance.

## (6) WHAT DID YOU LEARN FROM THE PROCESS?

Arleen and Ben are repeat guests at CI. This activity reinforced to me that our students really enjoyed and benefited from this excellent demonstration of flamenco music and dance. This event greatly enhanced our students' understanding of this musical tradition.

I estimate that there were 40 people attending this event, because every seat in Malibu #120 was full.


