(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

This series of FIVE concerts brought many professional musicians to CI to demonstrate African, Irish, jazz/world-music fusion, and Hindustani music to our CI students.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

My PAMU 332 World Music class learns about music from around the world. This series of concerts gave the students an "up close and personal" exposure to many types of international music, and to the interesting musicians who perform that music.

(3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The strength of this activity was that the students experienced world music styles being performed live in front of them. As the students reported after the concerts, a live performance is always so superior to You-Tube or other media. Another strength was our hands-on interactive participation workshop, where the students got to play a variety of ethnic music drums and percussion instruments.



It helped me better understand the historical roots of Irish music.



We have learned about the interment that was played in the concert the Kora and we just finished learning about the music in Africa and its Culture.


It is vertically aligned with what we are learning in class about the instruments as well as the culture behind where that music derives from.

It corresponds with our curriculum, readings, and assignments.


We are currently in an Indian music section that focuses primarily on Hindustani music.

It follows our current lectures and readings


It was a fun interactive event that helped us understand more about musical instruments.

The performance included pieces from the Classical and Romantic periods, both of which we have studied or are currently studying in class.


This activity coincided with class content on classical era compositions.

This performance showed us a successful way to be inspired by and incorporate world music into your own music. It also prevented various cultural influences in through the music.

It follows our coursework and textbook. It's helpful in terms of world music because it allowed us to see performers who learned music in our context take on music from another, and blend the two together.

It is easier to understand and appreciate and instrument when it is played live rather than just reading and seeing pictures.

Helped me learn more about the coursework in a live environment

The activity related to the class through the use of a fusion of different musical instruments and elements that were used. West African instruments alongside a jazz fusion with other different kinds of music.

In our course we as students are exposed to different types of music from all over the world and one of the objectives is to see the music and instruments we learn about live. This provides us with a first hand experience of how the instruments work and how the music sounds.

We have learned throughout about different instruments from south America and Africa which would make up some of the percussion sounds of the band. There was also some latin jazz that were played.

This is related to my class content because of the variety of rhythms, beats, and instruments that were used in the performance. For example, one of the drummers was playing 4 drums, 3 from Africa and one which was a Congo drum. He was also using instruments from the Caribbean islands (Cuba & Puerto Rico) and from brazil. They also played a song which was based off of polyphonic textures. We also engaged in playing clave son and clave rumba rhythms/beats by clapping. We also heard a song in which multiple beats were played within a bar, which is typical of Eastern/Middle-Eastern rhythms. This was a really wonderful and educative performance!

We saw some of the different drums and hand instruments from around the world, we practiced the clave rhythm, and we got to see our profressors play jazz in their band,


This activity related to the content and/or learning outcomes of the course that I am taking by allowing me to see at first hand a concert that included a mixture of different musical styles.
