(1) PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITY

Students from the Dance Ensemble class used Santa Rosa Island as creative inspiration for the Arts Under The Stars performance. The journey proved to be eventful and the journey informed the piece as much as the environment and topography. Please the pre-performance video to get an idea of the challenges the dance ensemble faced during the SRI trip and then see the piece titled *Vientos*-which means wind in Spanish. The piece was an exploration of sand, water, and the gravitational force the moon exerts and potentially their contribution to the formation and landscape of the island.

(2) HOW DID THE ACTIVITY RELATE TO A COURSE(S) AND/OR LEARNING OBJECTIVES?

Dance Ensemble explores different artistic approaches to research and creative development. The trip to Santa Rosa Island provided an intense and in depth immersion into an environmentally informed creative process.

(3) WHAT DO YOU SEE AS THE STRENGTHS OF THE ACTIVITY?

The immersion, teamwork, and collaborative nature of a three-day creative intensive gave the students depth to their dance-art making. The stunning raw beauty, isolation, and precariousness of the island provided a chance to rethink movement vocabularies while creating *Vientos*.

(4) WHAT WOULD YOU SAY ARE/WERE THE ACTIVITY'S WEAKNESSES?

It was the instructors first time to the Island, and she led the students on a wild goose chase because she was unfamiliar with the path they were on. This made the trip interesting, but difficult to get adequate video footage because of the exhaustion from the 15 mile hike. The wind also made it very difficult to dance and respond to the environment. Please watch the video to understand.

Be more clear on where we are going and take an informed guide. Having the experience would also allow me to make better decisions.

- We learned that the island's plans, although they contradicted our own, had given life to the piece. In the end, we had to adjust a lot of choreography, but it was in a way that reflected the winds of the islands and the strength of the elements. It added the character of the island to our piece instead of us trying to create it for ourselves. It was a powerful and exhausting experience, however it gave life and value to the piece and it also gave the island a power that we would otherwise had not been able to understand.
- Being able to learn about the island was very beneficial. Our school has a connection to the island and any student can come back with a newfound appreciation not just for our school, but for our environment. Conservation is extremely important and we should respect what we have. Water and the land are such valuable entities and we should not take it for granted. I think every student should have the chance to visit the island and be able to see how nature is untouched. It directly reflects our origins and the value we hold in ourselves to be delicate and the need to be well taken care of.
- I had no idea know how much I would have to push myself physically and emotionally.

 We were all out of our element. I don't think any of us knew how close we would grow towards each other or how sore we would be when Sunday came. But the experience really did push us to move and work with one another despite the difficulties we were all having trying to adjust to the island's rhythm of life.
- As we move forward I would like to maintain the same feeling of excitement and adventure that we had on the island. I felt so inspired by the simple ways the island

moved with the wind that I wanted to explore it even more. I felt myself wanting to use it as inspiration for movement in the future, to think of my movements more abstractly at times, such as; mimicking the movement of the wind going through the tall grass on a hill. Overall I feel like a more enlightened individual in a since after going to the island. I came away feeling more grounded and relaxed as a college student, and I found I was able to stay on task for my other classes easier. It was like a vacation of the mind where I was able to go away and do nothing, but think about dance abstractly and that was really freeing for my soul and the idea to never give up in life.
