Several students and faculty in the Performing arts program though generous funding of the IRA and an incredible gesture from one of the producers of *American in Paris* attended the Tony award winning Broadway show at the Pantages Theatre in Hollywood.

Students in performing arts need opportunities to see professional theatre at all levels. However, opportunities like *American in Paris* at the Pantages are often expensive. 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moving architecture pieces to create flowy transitions that fit with the style and mood of the musical. I was in awe how smoothly the show went which was likely the result of the cast's and production crews diligence and focus. It reinforced the value of hard work and persistence, and I was reminded once again of what takes to make your dreams a reality.

- Going to An American in Paris was an amazing part of my college experience. I had never sat that close to the stage, and I know for multiple students that was their first professional production. I had seen many before, but none in this format. I was surprised at how much dance was within the show as many musicals I've seen were not as dance based. Most musicals were focused on either acting or singing. I saw many things within the dance elements that have been presented to me in my dance classes. I also picked out many things such as thematic elements from my musical theatre class. I would not have been able to afford the tickets on my own as they were such good seats. I will always remember this trip as a valuable and educational experience.
- "An American In Paris" was an excellent opportunity to explore and experience something that I cannot get on campus. The Pantages is a fundamental part of the entertainment industry as far as live production and theater culture in Los Angeles. Tours from all around the world stop at the Pantages and we got to experience art that started in film, went to Broadway, and traveled across the continent. Just being there and seeing what we could do professionally inspires me to get to the Pantages someday and call it a workplace. Much like how students visiting the White House get inspired to pursue politics or how students that visit the Smithsonian are inspired to become archaeologists, students (regardless of age) are inspired or re-inspired by experiencing landmarks and institutions like the Pantages.

I also have the firm belief that the best producers and stage managers are all experienced in theater from the perspective backstage, on stage, and in the audience. As an audience member, I could appreciate the experience that the performers and technical artists have for me. Keeping this feeling in mind when I am creating for others is integral to the growth and development of the entertainment industry. I could also peek around on stage to see how they use set pieces and other technology to present the show.
