Brief Activity Description

SPED 545: Assessment of Students with Disabilities is required for all special education credential candidates; CSUCI post-baccalaureate students earning their preliminary education specialist teaching credential. Students are expected to learn how to give norm referenced assessments, analyze data, write reports based on that data, and communicate with families the findings in order to best serve student needs in Ventura County schools. Traditionally, this is done in English only, but understanding the linguistic needs of our surrounding community, I would like to expand this to include Spanish language assessment.

IRA and MFST funds have generously purchased Woodcock-Munoz assessment kits so our bilingual special education candidates can learn how to assess in Spanish in addition to the English assessment requirements of our program. In order to successfully determine a student's competence in the area of assessment in Spanish, a Dual Language expert needs to evaluate student work in Spanish so that credential students can graduate with the skills needed to assess, analyze and report in both English and Spanish.

The money requested from the IRA committee is to pay this person to do this work and allow our CSUCI students an opportunity to better serve our surrounding, linguistically diverse, community. See below for further details.

Learning Outcomes and Relation of IRA to Course Offerings

Course outcomes of SPED 545 mandate that students assess, analyze assessment data, write reports and communicate assessment results to families of students in elementary, middle and high schools with disabilities. Until last year, students, regardless of whether they are bilingual or not, were doing this only in English. Now, with the Woodcock-Munoz kits, we are able to do so in both English and Spanish- a great benefit to the families of Ventura County who are dominant Spanish speakers. I would like to pay a Dual Language expert to work with students on this skill in Spanish alongside the English instruction I provide in the class.

Over the course of the semester, students submit portions of a full assessment report to me in English, in accordance with Woodcock-Johnson (English) findings. This person would be responsible for meeting with bilingual candidates multiple times (no less than 7) over the course of semester to grade the same components submitted in English to me, in Spanish. In this way, at the end of the semester, students will have given the Woodcock batteries in English and Spanish, analyzed data, written reports and communicated with families in both languages. Additionally, this person will be integral in conversations in class about the implications of language attainment on assessment for disability identification and school based supports.

Description of Assessment Process

At the end of the semester, students who participate (all bilingual special education candidates) will have completed two fully functional assessments and corresponding reports in English and Spanish. These reports may or may not be used in actual IEP meetings – that information will be shared in the report. Additionally, the person will conduct a lesson on linguistic differences affect on assessment results. Students in the course will provide an evaluation which will also be included in the report.
