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## - 2. Brief Activity Description

Describe the activity and its relationships to the educational objectives of the students' program or major

### **Brief Activity Description**

Students have helped to design several projects, including an investigation of the relationships among estrogen, multitasking ability and other aspects of cognition, such as attention, working memory and spatial navigation capacity. Students participated in developing the IRB application, developing measures of multitasking and cognition, designing computer-based programs to test aspects of cognition, recruiting and testing participants, collecting and analyzing data, drawing conclusions and disseminating results. Currently, 7 students are participating in this project. In order to accurately assess the relationship between estrogen and these cognitive activities, estrogen levels will be assayed using an outside service. Additionally, we seek funding to procure two licenses for a computer software program, Inquisit, which will allow students to design and conduct experiments investigating various aspects of cognitive and social psychology and neurophysiology as well. The Inquisit licenses may also be used in other projects and do not expire. Other research underway by 6 additional students includes projects investigating the impact of stress on implicit biases; differences in reading comprehension and retention between electronic media and paper textbooks; the relationship between rumination and self-compassion; and a test of math-specific anxiety.

Next May marks the 100th Annual Convention for the Western Psychological Association, a landmark in the history of psychology and a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for our students. We anticipate having 13 students presenting their findings at the Convention and thus are requesting travel and conference funds. The opportunity to present their experimental findings and meet and network with others in the field can open doors to future graduate school opportunities and career paths.

These research projects are closely aligned with the second educational objective in Psychology, "Recognize, understand the strengths and weaknesses of, and be able to use, major research methods in psychology, including study design, data analysis and interpretation," as well as the fourth objective, "Demonstrate information competence and the ability to use computers and other technology for multiple purposes," and the fifth objective, "Use and respect skeptical inquiry, critical thinking and the scientific approach to understanding behavior." Students are integrating various methods of inquiry in their projects – for example, incorporating biological perspectives with cognitive techniques – and learning to use new technology to assess aspects of cognition. Students are reading the primary literature and developing expertise in experimental design and execution, data collection and analysis, and collaboration and scientific presentation.

### Learning Outcomes and Relation of IRA to Course Offerings

This will directly relate to Psychology 497 (Beers) and Psychology 497 (Thayer). Both courses support independent student research.

The IRA activity constitutes the coursework for all students involved. Students read primary scientific literature to learn about previous research on their project: for example, students working on the multitasking project read literature on (1) multitasking and other features of cognition, (2) how hormones influence cognition, and (3) what other cognitive assessments have shown with respect to the effect of hormones and estrogen in particular. Students are responsible for learning about conducting ethical research with human subjects and completing appropriate training. They recruit participants and interact with them in a variety of ways, from explaining the informed consent process, to collecting saliva samples for assaying estrogen, monitoring the various cognitive assessments, and completing a debriefing process. They learn about confidentiality and how to effectively collect data. Students are also responsible for gathering and otherwise developing all instruments necessary for the research, including programming in Superlab and Qualtrics. Students then analyze the data collected, using knowledge of statistical methods from other coursework. They draw conclusions and will present their findings at one or more scientific conferences where they have the opportunity to interact with other researchers and learn about new developments in the area. We anticipate students presenting these findings at the SAGE Student Research Conference as well as at the Western Psychological Association Convention next May.

A pilot study was undertaken in the Fall Semester of 2019 which was funded by the Psychology Program.

### **Description of Assessment Process**

At the end of the semester, students will submit an American Psychological Association (APA)-format scientific research paper detailing their experiment: the background, the methods, the findings (including statistical analyses as appropriate) and conclusions. Students will also prepare and submit research abstracts to selected student and professional conferences for publication of the studies' findings. If the abstracts are accepted, students will develop presentation materials, such as posters and slide presentations for professional talks. Successful completion of the research paper, conference abstract, and presentation are indicators of attainment of the educational goals. In addition, the students will complete a survey asking them about their experience with the project and how the project encouraged and supported their critical thinking skills, research experience and preparation for post-baccalaureate study.
