# 2. Brief Activity Description

Describe the activity and its relationships to the educational objectives of the students' program or major

#### **Brief Activity Description**

I will be the instructor of Ecology & the Environment (BIOL 433) during the Spring 2020 Semester, and I would like to propose and lead a field trip to Santa Rosa Island. This course explores selected topics in ecology, with special emphasis on the study of interactions among organisms and their environment. To this end, exposing students to novel environments, such as those found on and around the Island, will boost students' curiosity and will enhance retention of key concepts in ecology. The class will stay at Santa Rosa Island Research Station (SRIRS), which provides the ideal setting for a unique immersive learning experience. During our visit to SRIRS we will explore native and modified habitats, and learning will focus on central concepts in ecology including species interactions, food webs, ecological succession, nutrient cycling, and the origin of species or subspecies that are unique to the Channel Islands. A trip to Santa Rosa Island will foster students' personal and intellectual growth, and will encourage a life-long connection between the Channel Islands – the namesake of the university – and their individual journey. Furthermore, this activity will be directly connected with CSUCI's mission of broadening students' appreciation of the natural world, which in turn has strong ties with the history and culture of the Central Coast of California.

#### Administrative Time

I will need administrative support provided by Santa Rosa Island Research Station (SRIRS), including that of one SRIRS staff member who will accompany the class during the field trip and stay at the station. The minimum amount of time needed is three days in April 2020.

# 4. Activity Assessment

#### **Description of Assessment Process**

This field trip will be a required activity for the class. All students who participate in the trip will write a 2-page essay focusing on the natural history of a selected species, habitat, or biological community found on the Channel Islands. The essay may also highlight a particular ecological pattern or process; or a geological, paleontological, or cultural element of the islands' history. Within the essay, students will share their personal impressions of the field trip. While on the island, students will have two 1-hr periods where they will write journal entries describing their observations of marine and terrestrial environments. These observations will serve as the starting point for the essay described above, which will be completed upon returning from the trip. In contrast, students who are not able to participate on the trip will be required to complete a sizable alternative assignment (e.g., 4-page review focusing on five peer-review articles based on research conducted on the Channel Islands).

#### What is your intended audience and how do you intend to market this to your students?

Ecology & the Environment (BIOL 433) is an Upper Division, General Education course that recently became a Core Course in the Biology Program at CSUCI. The course is open to any student who has completed Organismal and Population Biology (BIOL 200). The course is also taken by students enrolled in other programs, and includes a combination of sophomores, juniors, and seniors. Most of these students have never visited the Channel Islands. This field trip will be a required activity for the class, and all students who participate in the trip will write a 2-page essay focusing on a selected topic as described in section 4 (Activity Assessment). To ensure there is sufficient enrollment, I will post flyers around Aliso Hall and other key buildings around campus, to increase interest and diversity of student participation.

### If this is an event that is off campus, how do you plan to bring back the benefit of this event to campus?

Before the end of the Spring 2020 Semester, I will share selected essays with other students and faculty at CSUCI. These essays will be shared through the Biology Program social media sites, and will also be made available for reposting via other platforms including those associated with SRIRS. All essays will include students' personal impressions of both the field trip and their stay at SRIRS, which will increase the visibility of the station.
