Brief Activity Description

The goal of the 2020 National Learning Stories Conference in Ann Arbor, Michigan is to provide CI students and early childhood teachers local, state and national (infant/ toddler, preschool, and K-3 teachers, and early childhood professionals) to benefit from attending the 2nd National Learning Stories conference in Ann Arbor, Michigan by participating and attending keynote address, workshops, panel presentation, and poster sessions from leading experts from across the United States and New Zealand on children's assessments practice, referred to as Learning Stories. Learning Stories is New Zealand's national early childhood assessment practice. Learning Stories are a formative assessment in which teachers document children's learning and development through written narrative observations. This Annual National Learning Stories Conference will be useful for infant/toddler, preschool, TK, and K-3rd grade teachers to use in their own classes, and to increase CI students' knowledge and practice of the Learning Stories formative assessment method. In spring 2020, the National Learning Stories Conference will host keynote speaker Wendy Lee, the renowned author of Learning Stories and Director of New Zealand's (NZ) Educator Leadership Project. Wendy Lee keynote address will focus on Learning Stories framework including, NZ bi cultural, bilingual national curriculum and connection to assessment practices, Learning Stories research, NZ early childhood educator assessment approach, and international application of the Learning Stories method. The Early Childhood Studies Program (ECS) would like CI students to experience this amazing opportunity to attend the National Learning Stories Conference which will be held in Ann Arbor, Michigan.
