1. Brief Activity Description

In April 2009, the Mathematics Program and the Math Club will host an intensive week's worth of activities focused on student research in the mathematical sciences. The centerpiece will be a week-long student conference featuring research presentations by students and faculty. This conference will provide an opportunity for **all** students in math classes (not just math majors) to participate and to present shorter-term and longer-term student projects. Our partners in this effort are the students and faculty at *Universidad Autónoma del Estado de Hidalgo* (UAEH), Mexico. We have been cooperating with UAEH since 2006, when a continent of CSUCI students and faculty traveled to UAEH for a similar conference, a trip that was repeated in 2008. In 2007 students and faculty from UAEH visited CSUCI for a week of student research-related mathematical activities. Collaborative scientific projects have been carried out between conferences.

This proposal is to support 3 invited faculty speakers and 6 students from UAEH to present their work at this event. The program includes short lectures in mathematics and its applications, including imaging, computer science, physics, psychology, biology, and art. We expect that this international exchange will stimulate undergraduate research, will facilitate new collaborations and exchange of ideas, and will support new friendships, cultural appreciation and social and political understanding.

This proposal furthers the international component of the CSUCI's mission and promotes excellence in education, as it gives our students the chance to participate in a small international event. Students from many majors will be invited to participate by either presenting a project or attending the activities. This conference continues a unique cooperation that enhances the international perspectives of our students and stimulates interest in Mexican culture and the Spanish language as well as in mathematics and its applications. CSUCI student clubs – MeCHa, the Physics Club and the Math Club – have expressed interest in hosting afternoon events for all participants, including museum trips (e.g. to the Getty, the Museum of Tolerance, etc.) and other destinations such as the Ventura harbor, the Santa Barbara mission, Santa Monica, Los Angeles, etc. The participation of foreign students and faculty will give our students a chance to speak a foreign language, to host people from different cultures, and to grow professionally and intellectually.

2. Relation to IRA Program to Course Offerings.

The IRA funded part of the proposal will be related to courses in Spanish, mathematics, physics, computer science and to other multicultural and international themes.

The courses most heavily involved are listed below.

- o MATH 318 Mathematics for Secondary Teachers
- MATH 330 Mathematics and Fine Arts

- o PHYS/PHYS 445 Image Analysis and Pattern Recognition
- o MATH 490 Special Topics: Combinatorics
- o MATH 499 Seminar
- MATH 494 Independent Studies
- o MATH 497 Directed Studies
- MATH 492 Internship.

Students will present their own research projects and study our guests' research results.

3. Activity Assessment

The main learning outcome of this proposal will be the opportunity for our students to present their projects to the wider audience, including foreign participants, and the experience they will gain from the international exposure of their work. Additionally, many CSUCI students will be exposed to foreign culture and language, will participate in events, and will use their Spanish to communicate. They will learn how to host a research event for the community and foreign guests and how to exchange and generate ideas. This visit will give recognition to the Ventura County, its undergraduate education and creative activities at Channel Islands. The students and faculty will have a chance to initiate new scientific contacts and discuss their research with colleagues in their fields. Talks will enhance CSUCI student and faculty learning and research opportunities. Specific objectives to be met are listed below:

- Undergraduate research presentations
- Cultural and scientific exchange
- Multicultural events and Spanish language enhancement
- Modern mathematical issues across the world.
- The scientific methods, approaches to applications and proofs
- Mexican culture and the Mexican perspective

The quality of the conference will be assessed through written surveys to be administered at the end of the conference.

4. Program Budget and Other Funding

We request full funding to host 3 faculty and 6 students from UAEH while they are in the USA for this scientific and educational event. UAEH will cover their other costs (air fare, their local transportation in Mexico, their indirect costs, materials for lectures, etc.). The budget page (p. 4) provides the details of the \$4,700 we are requesting from IRA.

5. Sources of Activity Support. Please list the other sources of funding, and additional support for the activity.

The Mathematics Program will support the conference with additional funding for refreshments and other small items. We will provide our guests with office and computer

access, and the conference will use classrooms already designated for mathematics program. UAEH will provide support as indicated in Section 4. We note that UAEH was very supportive of our students' and faculty travel to UAEH in our two previous visits, providing lodging, most food, and ground transportation in Mexico. We would like to be equally good hosts.
