Requirements and Signatures

Brief Activity Description. On behalf of students and academic departments, we seek external funding for a compelling exhibition of photographs, entitled "*Living Under the Trees*" from CRLA (California Rural Legal Assistance) based on farm workers in our local area and throughout California. Funding will provide the means to sponsor an array of academic and cultural activities and necessary purchasing costs which includes three areas:

Components

a.) Hosting a **Photography Exhibition** in the Broome Library by photographer David Bacon in Sept. 2009 accompanied by related exhibition of large format written narratives of farm worker housing and labor conditions. Includes a required hosting of a public reception for the work of the non-profit California Rural Legal Association of Ventura County on behalf of farm workers: (Curator costs, photos, narratives, and reception): **\$5,000**

b.) **Purchasing photographs--5 large format** (24 x 36) for permanent exhibition on campus. (Each print =\$ 550 + mount =\$200 ea (laminated to 3mil dibond, laminated UV protective coating). \$750 x 5= **\$3,750**

c.) **Purchasing digital rights** of a photograph series (# 50) for the library's digital collection for academic research use by CSUCI students, academic departments/professors, and interested community members. (\$ 100 per image x 50)=**\$5,000**).

TOTAL= \$13,750

<u>Rationale</u>

As our campus is located in the middle of prime agricultural property within Ventura County which benefits from agricultural economic prosperity and as some of our promising students are children of farm workers, the visiting exhibition and digital collection will broaden students' academic and cultural perspectives through academic engagement with the photo collection and written and oral narratives based our the working lives of the farm workers. It is also a way to honor the many contributions of farm workers to our local economy, culture, and society. **Relation to IRA to Course Offerings:** A variety of CSUCI academic departments and classes (see attached list) are interested in acquiring rights to use *digital* versions of the photographs for educational purposes. Here are a few examples of how photos and written narratives will be used in a variety of academic departments. With the acquisition of a *digital collection* (50 photographs of farm workers in Ventura County), the collection will provide a variety of opportunities for:

- Students in a variety of academic departments (Chicana/o Studies, History, Sociology, Economics & Business, Political Science, English, and Spanish) to use them as primary source documents for the study of the contemporary Chicana/o experience. They would be especially useful in preparing students for service learning projects that engage CSUCI students in working with this population.
- CSUCI teacher candidates using photos and narratives for creating family literacy projects based on photos and oral histories. In addition, teacher candidates would create history-social science lessons on local economy and its workers.
- CSUCI students in Business and Economics courses using the photos and narratives in presentations and projects that engage issues concerning ethics in labor and housing policies and practices.
- CSUCI students who partner with community-based service learning agencies, such as Cabrillo Economic Development Corporation and its farm worker housing projects throughout Ventura County, to create oral histories and community ethnographies on their particular economic and social history.
- CSUCI students in Capstone courses across disciplines using them in conjunction with scholarly research and primary sources about farm worker experiences and agribusiness to write reports or articles for publication in academic journals. The University Archive holds the records of the lawsuit that led to the building of the Villa Cesar Chavez in South Oxnard, and these photographs would supplement that document collection. If a student or faculty member wishes to have anything published that includes these photographs, copyright permission would be sought.
- CSUCI undergraduates in Education courses using the photos in Outreach and Service Learning Projects with K-12 children.

- Students in English and Spanish courses using photos and narratives in composition and critical thinking exercises to develop essays that engage the social, ethical, cultural, economic, and political contexts to which the photographs speak.
- CSUCI students already working on the Bracero Oral History project, an on-going partnership between CSUCI, the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History, and a national consortium of universities and other educational institutions.
- Our CSUCI University Preparation Schools (UPS & Middle School) and other surrounding farming community schools who will be invited to explore the exhibit and use for creating local agriculture and sustainable economy projects.

Assessment requirement

Assessment process will include a variety of measures: 1.) attendance report of the temporary exhibition, 2.) library usage form for digital collection, and 3.) student products (ethnographic research, interviews, written narratives, digital storytelling-DVD, etc.) created for individual courses, service-learning outcome reports, and capstone projects.
