Habitat Choice in Hawaii's Humpback whales A field based research and service learning opportunity for Science Majors.

1. Brief Description:

This field trip is a continuation of a research experience and service learning project that ran for the first time in spring '09. The course provides students with the opportunity to participate in a conservation-based research study and associated outreach activities.

The field trip will run over spring break '10; enrolled students will head to Maui, Hawaii, where they will be working with a local research organization, the Keiki Kohola Project. This is a non profit research organization that includes experienced field biologists, local boat captains, naturalists and student volunteers from the Marine Options program, at Maui Community College. Our students will join the research team and participate in the all aspects of their on going study of habitat utilization dynamics.

Students will also plan their own complementary research projects. Prior to the trip we will meet with students on a weekly basis. Students will work in small teams to develop specific research questions, relating to the abiotic factors that affect the region, such as water quality issues, and anthropogenic activities within the study area. Results obtained from the previous year's research will be used in planning the new questions to be addressed. Students will plan and design their own experiments and these will then be incorporated into their activities during the field trip.

Whilst on the islands, students will meet with representatives from local NGO's, local management officials from the Hawaiian Island Humpback Whale National Marine Sanctuary, and other researchers who are active in the conservation arena in the region. These different entities will inform our students on the politics and the practicalities of the unique challenges of marine management and conservation. Through first hand experiences on the water, combined with the information the students will gain from these meetings, students will gain a very realistic picture of the current conservation challenges that face this region.

As a constituent component of the course each student will research and produce a synopsis on a different management issue that is impacting the area, addressing issues such as the impacts of vessel traffic, sonar and climate change on marine mammals. The students will be expected to provide a web page layout, a poster and / or a fact sheet that summarizes the most accurate and up to date information on their topic. The web pages will be uploaded to the existing research website (www.caringforcalves.org). The posters will be displayed at the local national marine sanctuary, and at local public awareness events, such as Whale Quest, an annual event based on Maui, and the fact sheets will be compiled into booklets and distributed to boat captains and naturalists that work in the local whale watching trip. Naturalists and boat captains' onboard whale watching vessels become the frontline in public education and, while most are well versed in basic humpback whale ecology; recent and newly published information is not available to them. Our students' contributions will address this directly.

The content of the course as outlined addresses the larger program objectives of the Biology and Chemistry departments, as well as many of the specific objectives of Chemistry and Biology 492/494 courses.

Students who participate in the course will:

- Design experiments to test scientific hypotheses, collate data, conduct statistical analyses and evaluate research outcomes.
- Gain first hand experience in problem solving always a component of field research which involves animals in their natural setting.
- Identify topic appropriate research materials, synthesize information from a variety of sources and gain experience in effective communication of results in a variety of media.
- Develop communication skills and the ability to work as an effective team member in a diverse cultural setting
- Use analytic and data collection equipment in situ.
- Work as part of federally permitted research team, and contribute to ongoing efforts for the conservation of a federally listed, endangered species.
- 2. Relation of IRA to existing course offerings

Students will enroll in one of a number of potential courses, underscoring the interdisciplinary nature of the training and research. Biology students will enroll in either Biol 492 or 494, chemistry students will enroll in either Chem 492 or 494; in either case the course can fulfill a major requirement. Additionally, chemistry majors may substitute this course for Chem 251, Quantitative Analysis Lab. Students from other majors, for example ESRM, will be encouraged to enroll in any of these classes for credit as well. The goal is to involve students from diverse majors so that each can enrich the educational benefit of the other.

The work covered in the course complements a range of other biology and chemistry courses, including Behavioral Ecology (Biol 407), Marine Biology (312), Science and Public Policy (Biol 345) Quantitative Methods in Biology (Biol 203), Environmental Chemistry (Chem 301) and Quantitative Analysis (Chem 250/ 251).

Biology and chemistry students are already actively involved in a related laboratory based research project, under the supervision of the applicants (Chem/Bio 494), which explores the dietary and behavioral implications of blubber stratification and the ontogeny of neonate muscle tissues. The field course proposed here provides a practical, field based extension of this work. Taken cumulatively, the university will be well placed to address the current lack of active, ongoing research in marine mammals in this region. Gray whale mother and calf pairs use our offshore waters as a migratory corridor, humpback whales now regularly feed in the Santa Barbara Channel and a wide variety of dolphins and porpoises reside in the channel year round; these populations all offer related areas of further research that could be explored in the years to come, and incorporated into additional course- related and interdisciplinary activities.

3. Activity assessment

The course assessment will comprise two components, related to its two key deliverables:

1. Student research projects will be assessed according to a rubric that measures their engagement with research planning and preparation, design and subsequent data analysis; grades will be assigned based on this rubric.

2. The topics-based outreach component of the course will be assessed not only by the instructors, but by members of the target audience for the different media as well, using a voluntary survey form.

The students will also complete a self evaluation of both their research and their outreach activities using a rubric that they develop at the beginning of the term.

5. Sources of additional support.

This represents an in-kind donation of around \$2000 per student, based on current equivalent Earthwatch-type programs, which charge for participation in this type of project.

Production of outreach materials, web-hosting, posters, and booklets will be provided by the Keiki Kohola Project.

Onboard photographic and basic monitoring equipment will be provided by Keiki Kohola Project. Dr. Gillespie will provide additional equipment for field measurements from his research laboratory.

Students will also be involved in fund raising activities after the trip. Planned activities include the sale of photography and t. shirts. Production costs of these items will be covered by the Keiki Kohola Project. Profits generated will primarily be donated to offset the carbon footprint of the trip.

Attachment 1 – Appendix

Habitat Choice in Hawaii's humpback whales – Proposed research for Spring '10.

The research project that our students will be participating in looks at how abiotic factors influence habitat choice in humpback whales, during their wintertime residence in the waters of Hawaii. This field trip will comprise our second trip to Maui to participate in this project and will build on the success of this year's trip, both in terms of obtaining the data require to answer our research question, and in terms of establishing the presence of CSUCI within the marine mammal research community.

Experience gained in the first year of operation will be invaluable in the planning and execution of the second year's activities. Feedback from students that participated this year has been carefully considered and several changes have been made to next year's schedule. For example, although the main focus of this field trip remains the active involvement of students in conservation based research, we will also include a range of cultural activities to provide the students with a more informed and broad based experience of Hawaii and its culture. Planned activities will include a luau, and a series of hikes led by local guides. These will focus on culturally relevant regions of the island and the guides will be able to give our students some first hand insight into the nature of the islands and the close connection between the Hawaiian culture and land management issues.

Students that participated this year were extremely conscientious in data collection, collation and data input. This was all completed on a regular daily basis and will facilitate the prompt publication of the results obtained. Next year we will include additional computer hardware and software in our field equipment, so that we can complete more extensive data analysis on site and we plan to use appropriate software, such as Arc View, that can be set up in advance of the trip. Also, we found that students were more than ready to start research early each day, and trade off to a second team at mid day. Planning for this schedule will increase our field time, allow us to use a single boat some days, but still maximize our data collection. This schedule will also allow students time to participate in a range of land-based cultural activities, as mentioned.

The Keiki Kohola Project is a grass roots organization that works within the local Maui community and within the local marine mammal research community. Consequently, as our students are incorporated into this project, they are similarly assimilated into these local communities. The students that participated in the trip this year were excellent ambassadors for our university and represented the best of CSUCI students. We hope to build on this promising start and nurture these community connections, through a continued and consistent research effort and a yearly field presence on the water.

From a research perspective, we are making excellent progress. Our initial results clearly indicate that female and calf humpback whale pairs are not using the shallow, inshore waters within the study region and that sets them apart from all other baleen whales in nursery regions such as this. This study therefore addresses a very relevant and timely management issue within this region. We plan to submit our initial results for publication this summer, and we are confident that as we continue with this work we will attract positive attention for the contribution our students are making in this field, and potential outside funding, for the continuation of this work.
