1. **Brief Activity Description.** Describe the activity and its relationship to the educational objectives of the students' program or major.

This application is for the support of the Performing Arts annual stage production in conjunction with PA 391 Production, which is cross-listed with ART 391. It is a PA core-course scheduled for Spring 2010, that is required of all Performing Arts majors, offered as an elective for Art majors, and open to all students at CSUCI. PA 391 is a vital component of the learning experience for all PA majors. It addresses the PA Program Learning Outcomes providing students with an opportunity to collaborate with peers from a diverse range of artistic and cultural backgrounds to produce a live stage performance.

Student participation includes performing on stage before a live audience, designing scenic elements for the show, assisting the director and stage-manager, researching the performance/production history, coordinating stage-costuming and accessories, running the front-of-house, and writing programs and publicity. Students work on the technical preparation, rehearsal, and performance of a stage play that culminates in public presentations for CSUCI students, faculty, staff, and the general community.

The **objective** of the Spring 2010 PA 391 Production course is to place **students at the centre of the learning experience**. This project will feature the work of CSUCI students through their designs, performances, and other production work vital to the show's success. Capstone students from the Art program will design and paint a backdrop, PA majors, minors, and other CSUCI students will act on stage, and others will run lights and sound during the show, as well as supervise seating and ticket sales for each performance. During the **current budgetary crisis**, and in an attempt to **reduce overall costs**, monies acquired from the IRA will be used for equipment, independent contractors, and supplies that are essential for the students to carry out their work.

This year PA 391 will stage *Heidi Chronicles*, written by **Wendy Wasserstein**. This contemporary American play, which has won the Pulitzer Prize, the Tony Award, and numerous other prizes, is a witty comedy examining American society, especially women's rights, from the sixties to the eighties. The **size of the cast is flexible**. There are twenty-two acting parts, all of which can be performed by as few as eight actors who play multiple roles, or there can be one actor for each different part. In spring 2010 the director for this play will be Dr. Luda Popenhagen, who will be collaborating with other faculty (Art, Business, Computer Science, English, and PA) to **advise and guide students on this project**.

3. Activity Assessment. Describe the assessment process and measures that the program will use to determine if it has attained its educational goals. Please note a report will be due at the end of the semester.

The following assessment and evaluation tools will be used: the formal student evaluations (SETEs), the IRA student evaluation forms and reports, and attendee lists will be submitted. As part of the course requirements for PA 391, students will be required to write reflection papers summarizing their learning experience for this project. Samples of these papers will be submitted, and the remainder made available upon request.

This student-centered project will focus on providing services and supplies which will **enhance the student learning experience**. This will **reduce overall production costs** as the students will constitute the majority of the design and production teams necessary to realize a stage production. The IRA funding requested in this application will cover the costs of supplies and equipment so students may engage in this project to the **best of their abilities**.

The **overall expenditure** projected for the upcoming spring production will be significantly less than those acquired from multiple sources in the previous year. Last year's very successful production which received IRA funding for \$7,400 also obtained assistance from Advancement and the generous support of the M.V. Smith School of Business and Economics. In Spring 2010 all funding is **totally reliant** on financial **assistance from IRA funds**.

In Spring 2010 PA 391 will be taught (rehearsed and performed) inside the PA classroom/teaching space, **MA 140**. There will be no need to request OPC to set up chairs for this event, as the **seats** and the **risers** (already purchased) will be **in place**. The scenic elements for this show will be designed and executed by Art capstone students. There will be no major construction or building of the stage set, and furniture (chairs, tables, etc.) will draw on the PA program's existing supply of such items.

Painting supplies needed by students to paint the stage backdrop and floor for this project are estimated to be \$2,000. Posters and programs will be designed by other Art capstone students. Printing costs are estimated to be \$850. The purchase of stage props and specific items/objects integral to the play will be \$500.

Costumes will be rented for a total of \$2,500 for the twenty-two characters in the play. This includes sewing supplies necessary for any adjustments and dry-cleaning before the costumes are returned. Cleaning supplies for costume maintenance will be \$50. Costume accessories are estimated to cost \$200. Make-up and hair-styling products purchased for the use of each student performing one of twenty-two characters on stage is estimated at \$350.

For the lighting of the show, in addition to the existing **lighting equipment** already owned by the PA Program, the following equipment will be necessary: \$1,000 for rental of lighting **instruments and cables**, \$50 for the purchase of lighting **color gels**, and \$2,500 for the rental of an **overhead truss** and its installation. Assistance from **OPC** will cost \$300 (estimate) to re-install the **electric cable** into MA 140 which will allow the lighting and **sound equipment** to draw up to 120 amperes of power when the show is in progress.

The **royalty fee** for the play, *Heidi Chronicles*, is \$75 per show. It is projected that there will be **5 performances**. **Ticket prices** will be: *gratis* for CSUCI students, \$5.00 for all other students with ID, \$10.00 for CSUCI faculty and staff, and \$15.00 for members of the general public. In MA 140 there will be seats for approximately 100 spectators for each performance. Out of a possible overall total of **500 spectators**, and given that more than half will be **CSUCI students (free admission)**, estimated revenue from ticket sales is \$1000. Also, the **ticket agency** (Brown Paper tickets) now charges a flat fee of \$1.99 for each ticket. So for the processing of a possible total of 500 tickets, the cost will be \$1,990.

As there is **very little infrastructure** at CSUCI to support the creation of a stage production, it will be necessary to engage **specialized theatre personnel**. Their expertise is beyond the knowledge and skills of our existing students, and will contribute to the **learning experience of our students**. These experts include part-time faculty on campus, e.g., the lighting designer, John Price, in Computer Science, and self-employed stage-managers/technical directors (TBD) currently working in Ventura County. The total cost of their **honoraria and stipends** for assisting and enhancing the production will be \$5,000.

Finally, an additional \$1,000 should cover any unexpected or unforeseen **miscellaneous expenses** necessary for PA 391 Production. (<u>Please see details on page 7 of this application.</u>)
