Guest author: Mariano Zaro's Poemas de la erosión/Poems of Erosion

The Spanish program would like to bring Mr. Mariano Zaro, a Spanish college instructor and author who currently lives in Southern California, to discuss one of his poetry books "Poemas de la erosión/Poems of Erosion." *Please find attached a biography of Mr. Mariano Zaro and reviews of his book.* The speaker also plans to integrate, in addition to his lecture, students' creative reading and response activities as part of his presentation.

The Spanish program asserts that this presentation would meet the Spanish program's student learning outcomes, which are:

- Demonstrate a reasonable understanding of the ways of thinking (ideas, beliefs, attitudes, values, philosophies) of the Spanish-speaking world.
- Demonstrate a reasonable understanding of the behavioral practices (patterns of social interactions), and the cultural products (for example, art, history, literature) of the Spanish-speaking world.
- To foster students' Spanish language acquisition in all four language skills (speaking, listening, reading, and writing).

Relation to IRA to Course Offerings. All IRAs must be integrally related to the formal instructional offerings of the University and must be associated with scheduled credit courses. Please list all classes that relate to the program proposed.

Two Spanish courses, Spanish 302 (Advanced Spanish, Part II), and Spanish /English 311 (Bilingual Literary Studies), will integrate this activity into their curriculum. All other Spanish courses will be encouraged to participate. In addition, all other Spanish courses will have the opportunity to earn extra-credit by attending and writing a brief summary of this activity.

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

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BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Mariano Zaro is the author of three poetry books: Where From/Desde Donde (Bay Books, Santa Monica), Poems of Erosion/Poemas de la erosión and The House of Mae Rim/La casa de Mae Rim (both with Carayan Press, San Francisco). His poems have been included in the anthologies Al Aire Nuevo (San Luis Potosí, Mexico), New Baroque (Los Angeles), LA Melange (Los Angeles) and Luces y Sombras (Tafalla, Spain). As a fiction writer, his short stories have appeared in several literary journals in Spain and the United States: Menos 15, El signo del gorrión, Caracola, The Louisville Review, Poeticdiversity, The Baltimore Review, Pinyon and The Portland Review. In 2004 he received the Roanoke Review Short Fiction Prize. He earned a Ph.D. in Linguistics from the University of Granada (Spain) and a Master's in Literature from the University of Zaragoza (Spain). He conducts poetry workshops and he currently teaches Spanish and Spanish Literature at Whittier College, Rio Hondo College and Pasadena City College.

"Geologically speaking, the word "erosion" usually signifies the natural wearing away of seemingly indomitable masses over time. Operating in a more human level, however, Spanish poet Mariano Zaro (who now lives in Los Angeles) charts the small, almost imperceptible diminutions in ourselves and those we love. He tries to capture those insightful moments of perception before they fade. His poems -from the very first brief one- "All I write/vanishes/before/it is written"- seem to have been whittled down to a stark, minimal essence, burying large themes within the simplest language, in which lines, often of one word, or list of things, moments, emotions, record the loss of well, just about everything we value. Some poems are addressed directly and ruefully to another person, a recipient surely of love and lust and the sharing of unwanted but inevitable loss: "Return / leave me your smell / deep / tattoo / of summer flames." Since the poems are printed in both English and Spanish on facing pages, they echo each other in interesting ways, even if you don't know Spanish, it adds a great deal to the pleasure of Zaro's work to read both aloud- the Spanish versions by the nature of the language have a sway to them that forms a rhythmic tension with the terseness of the English. The last poem, "Epilogue/Epílogo", layers the two languages together in a bilingual mosaic, creating a crosscultural letter to the world."

"The experience of reading poet Mariano Zaro's second published collection of work, *Poems of Erosion*, is one of pure intimacy, of being grabbed and enfolded in the gay Spaniard's arms as he whispers feverishly and reveals his private loves, desires, and jealousies: "I hear your voice / distant / alien. / Your voice with others. / I made no noise. / I was so close. / Only the marble knew." As the title of his collection suggests, the poet's veneer gradually erodes to reveal a blatantly honest and beautifully study of what it is to be a gay man –passionate yet imperfect— as he lives his life. This is the key to what makes this collection so powerful: Zaro's life may be the artistic foundation on which the collection of poems is based, yet he simultaneously holds up a mirror to the reader. He seems to command, through words used as daggers and caresses, the same process of erosion to reveal our own vulnerable but altogether human true selves."

I've only recently been introduced to Mariano Zaro's work, and to Mariano himself tonight. Here's what I can tell you:

He writes in both English and Spanish, but even with more than one tongue doing his bidding, he is not the sort to say too much. Rather, there is in his work sometimes a lush...spareness, a sensuous...pulling back, from excess.

He notices what vanishes, as well as what stays.

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
