As a follow up to the Chicana/o Studies Lecture Series that successfully occurred in the Fall of 2009, the programs of Chicana/o Studies and History will invite Chicano Secret Service and El Teatro Campesino's founding artistic director, Luis Valdez, to perform and speak respectively during the week the State of California's late March celebration of Cesar Chavez birthday. Preceding this event, the first installment of this program will entail a solo performance by a Chicana performance artist, either Monica Palacios or Maria Elena Gaitan.

As has been the case with previous Chicana/o Studies and History IRA supported programming, we expect significant attendance from the university's service area population.

This series speaks to the respective programmatic educational objectives of COMMUNICATION, ENGLISH, HISTORY, PERFORMING ARTS, and SOCIOLOGY that:

- Demonstrate knowledge of the history and culture of people of Mexican and Latin American origins in the United States, specifically within the region of Southern California. (CHS)
- Examine gender as a central theme of the study of the Chicana/o community. (CHS)
- Analyze the literary expression of Chicanas/os and Latinas/os. (CHS)
- Distinguish variations within Chicana/o communities in respect to class, culture, ethnicity, gender, race, and sexuality. (CHS)
- Examine texts, issues or problems in the discipline from multiple perspectives (multicultural, interdisciplinary, international, experiential, theoretical and/or educational) (ENGL)
- Good understanding and knowledge of the history of North America. (HIST)
- Good understanding and knowledge of global history in other regions of the world. (HIST)

Furthermore, being very excited about your visit we would enjoy taking you and your wife, Lupe, out to a nearby restaurant before or after your March 15 presentation.
