1. **Brief Activity Description.** Describe the activity and its relationship to the educational objectives of the students' program or major.

The month of April has been designated Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) in the United States. The goal of SAAM is to raise public awareness about sexual violence and to educate communities and individuals on how to prevent sexual violence. Given that sexual violence is both a social ill that calls for civic engagement and one that is based on commonly held cultural values around sex and gender, the Centers for Community Engagement (CCE) and Multicultural Engagement (CME) are seeking funds to bring Minh Dang, a sexual assault survivor to campus for SAAM in spring 2010.

Minh, a graduate of UC Berkeley, currently working at Cal Corps Public Service Center, has embarked on a national university/college speaking tour to raise funds for child abuse survivors. Her visit will be twofold: consisting of class visits where she will share her heroic journey as a survivor of child trafficking and speak about how child abuse relates to issues of child trafficking, domestic violence, and sexual assault.

In addition, a showing of the MSNBC and Santoki Productions' documentary "Sex Slaves: Minh's Story," will be shown and she will be available for a Q&A afterwards. The documentary will be targeted toward students in the courses listed below but will also be marketed to ALL students on campus. This will be done by working with units within Student Affairs such as the Multicultural and Women's & Gender Center, Housing, Clubs and Organizations.

As she shares in her documentary, "As a survivor myself, I experience the repercussions every day. At the same time, I have had tremendous help on my healing journey and want to extend that help to others. My hope is to support the healing efforts of survivors so that they can break the cycle of violence in their own lives and play key roles in a movement to end child abuse." Minh's story will illuminate the issue of human trafficking and invisibility of child abuse, its deep impacts, and the opportunities for healing.

This event is relevant as it relates to and supports the mission, values, and learning objectives of all the various stakeholders. For example the CCE's mission is: To foster a learning community that facilitates learning for civic engagement in our local and global communities and addresses societal challenges. The CME promotes working toward a just, pluralistic society to end all forms of oppression so that all people engage with mutually egalitarian respect. Minh's work to end childhood sex trafficking serves these missions.


The main costs associated with the events will be travel and honorarium, which would be paid for with IRA funds. There are no other sources of support currently identified.
