1. **Brief Activity Description**. Describe the activity and its relationship to the educational objectives of the students' program or major.

Many faculty teach courses with an integrated service learning component. Service Learning often involves a community agency or organization serving children and youth with educational support and mentoring. The majority of these agencies require all volunteers to be fingerprinted through LiveScan. Fingerprinting volunteers and service learners has also been recognized as a model practice to provide for the safety and well being of children and youth. LiveScans are available on the CI campus, but at the cost of \$20 for the initial fingerprint and an additional charge of \$32 to \$100 depending upon the purpose of the LiveScan. For service learning students, conducting a LiveScan amounts to an out of pocket cost of between \$52 and \$120. This cost prohibits many students from participating in the full educational experience offered through their course. In addition, the only acceptable forms of payment Campus Police accept are MasterCard, Visa or Debit cards. Many CSUCI students are not in possession of these forms of payment and have to rely on their parents to supply this financial support. This cost and payment process prohibits many students from participating in the full educational experience offered through their SL course. The IRA request for Service Learning LiveScan Support would provide full funding for students during the 2011-2012 academic year. This service will be made available to all SL students who chose a community partner where Live Scan was a requirement. Therefore, students will be able to self-select to use or not use Live Scan resources.

Relation to IRA to Course Offerings. All IRAs must be integrally related to the formal instructional offerings of the University and must be associated with scheduled credit courses. Please list all classes that relate to the program proposed.

CI currently offers 20 courses a semester that have a service learning component. They include courses from the following programs: Chicana/o Studies, Liberal Studies, Education, Sociology, Liberal Studies, Early Childhood Studies, Spanish, and Communication.

An evaluation of the program's success will be compiled through examination of the Utilization Report and the Impact Study.

1. Brief Activity Description:

- a. Event 1: This is an event to benefit the students in PAMU 337, Music in History course and open to all other CSUCI students who would like to attend. Dr. Craig Russell is the preeminent scholar on Early California Mission music, and his lecture and performance will greatly enrich the class experience as well as bolstering the multicultural component of the course. This presentation will encourage the students to ask questions on the music of their region, and their cultural heritage.
- b. Event 2: This event to benefit the students in ART/PAMU 385 Audio Design course. Dr. Cole is a leading Recording Arts educator and will enrich the class with his knowledge of recording techniques, Pro Tools and acoustics in a lecture/clinic. This presentation will encourage the students to ask questions on all matters relating to recording.
- c. Event 3: Live performance with Charlene Chi, mezzo-soprano. This is an event to benefit PAMU 202, Beginning Group Guitar class. This performance will demonstrate guitar techniques, the accompanying abilities of the guitar, and musical phrasing (best modeled by a vocalist). The presentation will encourage the students to ask questions on the program, guitar techniques, vocal techniques and performance techniques. Dr. Chi will also be available to teach the vocal students at CSUCI, something that Dr. KuanFen Liu, CSUCI vocal faculty, supports.
- 2. Relation to IRA Program to Course Offerings: This is request is related to the PAMU 337, Music in History course, the ART/PAMU 385, Audio Design course and the PAMU 202, Beginning Group Guitar course but the event is announced via flyers, the PA Facebook page, and several global campus email to all CSUCI students, faculty and staff. I will also cross announce this event to my ART/PAMU 385 Audio Design course, my PAMU 202 Beginning Group Guitar class, my private students at CSUCI, as well as my two sections of UNIV 110 classes. I also send out invites to faculty in Performing Arts and encourage them to make their students aware of this opportunity.
