1. **Brief Activity Description.** Describe the activity and its relationship to the educational objectives of the students' program or major.

The IRA proposal is being put forward by Center for Community Engagement and the Chicano Studies program. Our funding request is two-fold, 1) provide funding to build a permanent Bracero Exhibition at a former Bracero camp in Ventura County and 2) provide funding to publish a book of 64 Bracero oral histories in both Spanish and English with proceeds going to the Bracero Student Scholarship Fund.

Project History - In 2008-2009 the Bracero Oral History Project served as service learning component for Chicana/o Studies, History, Library, and Spanish programs. The scope of the service learning project included: students organizing, promoting, and participating in town hall meetings to recruit potential Braceros to interview, students following up with each ex-Bracero and conducting oral history interviews, students transcribing interviews and translating them from Spanish to English. To date two town hall meetings (Oxnard and Santa Paula) have been conducted, over 100 former Braceros have signed up to share their stories, over 64 oral histories have been collected by CI students, and several dozen documents, photographs, and artifacts have been retrieved. These stories, archival documents and artifacts were used to design a local exhibition focusing on the Ventura County Bracero experience. This local exhibition contains 20 posters (some of which need to be redesigned and edited).

During spring 2011, the Center for Community Engagement and Chicana/o Studies were approached by Cabrillo Economic Development Corp (CEDC) to collaborate in designing a permanent exhibition space for the local exhibit. This exhibit space will be located in their new community housing development in Piru, on the former site of the Piru Bracero camp. This is an exciting opportunity for CI students' to work across disciplines/campus to build a permanently exhibit. We would like to produce a high quality project for CEDC. To do so, we will need funding to provide transportation for students to Piru and CSUCI, redesign and reprint posters, and print more brochures and t-shirts.

Another related project is to publish a collection of Bracero oral histories in both Spanish and English. Capstone students will work on writing brief biographies of ex-braceros, copyediting the interview transcripts in Spanish and English, and complete the book manuscript to be submitted for publication. We are considering submitting the manuscript to Palgrave Studies in Oral History series: http://us.macmillan.com/series/palgravestudiesinoralhistory. This book would serve as a vehicle for a fundraising activity and proceeds would go towards the

established CI Bracero Student Scholarship Fund.

The Service Learning Activities that would result from IRA funding will include:

Students enrolled in **Art Studio Capstone 499** will work with CEDC to build and curate the Ventura County Local Bracero exhibit.

Students enrolled in **English Capstone 499 will** serve as copyeditors for the Ventura County Bracero book.

Students enrolled in Chicana/o Studies Capstone 499 will research and write the introduction for the Ventura County Bracero book.

Students enrolled in **Spanish Capstone 499** will proofread and translate interviews from Spanish to English.

Relation to CI Mission: Academic Service learning is mission-based value at CI that is integrated into the formal instruction of these course offerings. Service Learning is associated with increasing a student's feeling of connectedness with the community, and understanding of economic, political and social conditions; encourage a more holistic approach to larger social issues--all of which these projects promote.

Relation to Course Offering: Faculty members from History, Art Studio, Chicana/o Studies, and Spanish co-sponsor this request because they have identified the importance of these Bracero oral histories that address many societal issues such as labor rights, civil rights, immigrant rights, and social justice. By oral histories will also be used for teaching purposes and student research projects in courses.

We will assess the Piru Bracero Exhibit by collecting audience comments and feedback from local residents. Another way we can assess the project is by how many books will be sold and funds collected for the Bracero Student Scholarship Fund.
