Water Conflict: Policy and Communicative Implications (Class Visits and Campus-wide Event)

1. Description:

The Communication, Political Science and Environmental Science & Resource Management Programs will co-sponsor a campus wide speaking event, "Water Conflict: Policy and Communicative Implications" featuring Dr. Tarla Rai Peterson, Professor and Boone & Crockett Endowed Chair, Wildlife & Fisheries, Texas A&M (see attached CV). This event focuses on the interdisciplinary connections between environmental conflict, policy development and communication and will be open to the all students.

In addition to an all-campus event, Dr. Peterson will give two classroom presentations, tailoring her presentation to compliment current course curriculum. Dr. Peterson will speak to students enrolled in *COMM/ESRM/POLS 443 Environmental Communication* about the role of symbolism and language as it relates to our interaction and social construction of the environment. Dr. Peterson will also speak to students enrolled in *UNIV 298: Water & Conflict in the West* about the history and impact of water rights on contemporary water conflict.

The all campus event is related to general course offerings in various programs such as Communication, Political Science, and Environmental Science & Resource Management. The classroom presentations and guest lectures are specific to:
