#### 1. Description:

The Communication Program, in conjunction with Ventura Center for Dispute Settlement (VCDS) has co-sponsored a mediation conference at Channel Islands (CI) the past two years. Both of these conferences brought together community members, local mediators, and CI students, staff and faculty for a one-day discussion on how to strengthen community through conflict management and communication. Both of these events engaged over 80 participants in discussions surrounding restorative justice, apology, moving beyond impasse and ethical dimensions of mediation and conflict management. CI faculty, students and staff attended the conference for free representing over 40% of total participants. (Please see the attached conference marketing material from previous conferences). Because of the success of the past two conferences, the Communication Program desires to continue to co-sponsor this conference annually on CI's campus and have chosen Saturday, March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2013 to host the 3nd Annual Mediation Conference. This event is in line with the CI pillar focused on community engagement to foster a learning community and one of the learning outcomes of the Communication Program, to learn communication techniques of conflict management.

#### 2. Relation to course offerings.

This all campus event is related to general course offerings in various programs such as Communication, Political Science, Sociology, and Business. Specifically it relates to the following classes:

- COMM 340: Conflict Management & Mediation
- COMM 210: Interpersonal
- COMM 220: Group Communication

#### 3. Assessment

Students (as well as faculty, staff and community members) attending the conference will be asked to fill out a survey evaluating the presentations. Students enrolled in the above mentioned courses will be asked to write a 1-page assessment of the event relating it to course teachings.
